Iran says 'new framework of cooperation' agreed with IAEA

Iran has agreed new terms of cooperation with the UN atomic watchdog regarding the agency's investigation into Tehran's nuclear activities, a top Iranian official said here Tuesday.

But the head of Iran's Atomic Energy Organisation, Ali Akbar Salehi, declined to say what the new cooperation would entail. A source close to the International Atomic Energy Agency told AFP that nothing substantially new had been agreed between the two sides.

Misreading the Iranian Situation

The Iranians have now agreed to talks with the P-5+1, the five permanent members of the U.N. Security Council (the United States, the United Kingdom, France, Russia and China) plus Germany. These six countries decided in late April to enter into negotiations with Iran over the suspected Iranian nuclear weapons program by Sept. 24, the date of the next U.N. General Assembly meeting. If Iran refused to engage in negotiations by that date, the Western powers in the P-5+1 made clear that they would seriously consider imposing much tougher sanctions on Iran than those that were currently in place. The term "crippling" was mentioned several times.

Obviously, negotiations are not to begin prior to the U.N. General Assembly meeting as previously had been stipulated. The talks are now expected to begin Oct. 1, a week later. This gives the Iranians their first (symbolic) victory: They have defied the P-5+1 on the demand that talks be under way by the time the General Assembly meets. Inevitably, the Iranians would delay, and the P-5+1 would not make a big deal of it.

Secretive spending on US intelligence disclosed

Intelligence activities across the U.S. government and military cost a total of \$75 billion a year, the nation's top intelligence official said on Tuesday, disclosing an overall number long shrouded in secrecy.

Dennis Blair, the U.S. director of national intelligence, cited the figure as part of a four-year strategic blueprint for the sprawling, 200,000-person intelligence community. In an unclassified version of the blueprint released by Blair's office, intelligence agencies singled out as threats

Iran's nuclear program, North Korea's "erratic behaviour," and insurgencies fuelled by militant groups, though Blair cited gains against al Qaeda.

Study Faults Bush's Emphasis On Daily Intelligence Brief

Under President George W. Bush, the President's Daily Brief -- the highly classified intelligence paper delivered each morning to the White House -- rose to "an unprecedented level of importance," with negative consequences for the intelligence community, according to a new study by the Brookings Institution.

These included "skewing intelligence production away from deeper research and arms-length analysis" and driving analysts to choose "the latest, attention-grabbing clandestine reports from the field," says the study, released Tuesday, called "The U.S. Intelligence Community and Foreign Policy: Getting Analysis Right."

At times, Bush had analysts who had been working on high-concern issues he read about in the daily brief, or PDB, conduct hour-long "deep dives" on those topics, with top policymakers present. "Not infrequently the briefings and surrounding discussions by key players would produce immediate policy decisions," the study says.

US is shifting spy strategy to counterintelligence and cybersecurity

The top U.S. intelligence official said counterintelligence and cybersecurity would be given new emphasis under a four-year strategic plan he unveiled Tuesday, Sept. 15.

Director of National Intelligence Dennis Blair told reporters that although combating extremism, issuing warnings, countering weapons proliferation and supporting military operations overseas remain major priorities, the 16 agencies that make up the U.S. intelligence community must also work to keep abreast of technical innovations and developments in information technology.

US annual intelligence budget '\$US75b'

The United States spends \$US75 billion (\$A87.02 billion) a year on intelligence, a top official says, revealing for the first time the overall cost including military-related activities.

Director of National Intelligence Dennis Blair gave the full budget figure as he delivered his 2009 National Intelligence Strategy on Tuesday, a blueprint outlining the priorities for the next four years.

Budgets for America's 16 intelligence agencies and their 200,000 employees were until 2007 a closely-guarded secret. The figure for non-military intelligence work was given as \$US47.5 billion (\$A55.11 billion) last year.

Seventy-five billion dollars (\$A87.02 billion) a year represents well over 10 per cent of the annual US defence budget of around \$US650 billion (\$A754.19 billion).

The Discreet Charms of CIA Morale

Opponents of accountability for intelligence excesses, such as former officials and media commentators, speaking out against Attorney General Eric Holder's recently announced inquiry into CIA's torture and detention program, complain that scrutiny hurts CIA morale. Such a stance betrays a simplistic, overgeneralized, and idealized view of CIA culture, and the most recent appearance of the CIA morale canard is political cherry-picking: before Holder announced his preliminary probe, even before Obama promised an end to torture and detention, morale at CIA was sagging.

For anyone who's ever worked at CIA, or even paid attention to the news about CIA, that morale problem thing has been around a long, long time, which kind of takes the punch out of the claim that more investigation leads inexorably to less effective, lower quality intelligence and frowny-faced spies.

When the Lehman Brothers banking firm collapsed a year ago this week, it prompted a financial panic that spread around the world. In February, with unemployment soaring and international trade in free fall, Adm. Dennis Blair, the director of national intelligence, advised Congress that the global economic crisis had replaced terrorism as the country's "primary near-term security concern."

U.S. intelligence analysts had concluded that a sharp drop in international money flows raised the prospect of destabilizing social unrest in countries with scarce resources and fragile governments.

Five dead, documents destroyed at Russian GRU base

A fire at a Russian military intelligence base has killed five servicemen and destroyed important secret documents.

The blaze rapidly spread through an administrative building of the military intelligence services in the city of Tambov, about 500km southeast of Moscow. Two officers and three soldiers died in the fire, the defence ministry said, adding that a further seven people were taken to hospital for treatment. "The fire seriously damaged a secret section which contained particularly important state documents," an official from the Russian special services told news agency RIA-Novosti.

"According to initial reports, the damage is considerable."

Lieberman didn't sign any arms deals during his swing through Ethiopia, Kenya, Nigeria, Ghana and Uganda. But Israeli officials estimate there are African arms contracts worth hundreds of millions of dollars waiting to be grabbed by Israel's export-hungry defence firms.

Yossi Melman, who writes extensively on Israel's intelligence establishment, questioned whether Israel should be engaging in such activities instead of sending in agricultural advisers and medical and educational experts to such economically distressed countries.

Russia using advertising company over ads against US radar in CZ



Last week, the Big Board provided the opponents of the planned stationing of an US missile defence system radar in Czech Republic from the No to Bases civic group with advertising space on its ten billboards, a service for which the group would otherwise had to pay hundreds of thousands of crowns, Aktualne.cz points out. The management of the company dismissed the information as nonsense.

SAS trains Libyan troops



The SAS has been ordered by the Government to train Libyan special forces despite the country having armed the IRA, The Daily Telegraph can disclose.

Eight years after the attack on New York, intelligence reports from captured western recruits suggest the terror network is weakening.

Eight years after the September 11 attacks in the US, it is clear that the threat to the UK remains. MI6 reports own officer over torture claims

Police in London said Friday they are investigating an allegation of torture involving a British intelligence officer.

The Metropolitan Police said it was asked by the attorney general to investigate the case. The British Secret Intelligence Service -- also known as MI6 -- referred the case to the attorney general, the police said. "It is very important that any such allegations are thoroughly investigated," said William Hague, the foreign affairs spokesman of the opposition Conservative Party. "Torture or complicity in torture is unacceptable, immoral, and counterproductive." Hague urged the government last month to look into allegations of torture of detainees at the U.S. Navy base at Guantanamo Bay, Cuba, and in Egypt, Pakistan, and Uzbekistan. His request followed a report from Parliament's Joint Committee on Human Rights that recommended an independent investigation into the allegations.

Foreign Secretary David Miliband said Friday that the British government wholeheartedly condemns torture.

"As happened last year ... top jihadist forums affiliated with Al Qaeda began experiencing technical problems, culminating in their ultimate closure on September 10, 2009," the group said in a statement.

According to SITE, members of other jihadist forums expressed annoyance and "confusion" at the inability to access the Web sites and forums where they share updates and messages.

Iraqi WMD researcher cooperated with Polish secret service,

Polish daily newspaper Rzeczpospolita reports that an Iraqi chemist who allegedly knew of Saddam Hussein's plans and who had been involved in the country's top secret project on weapons of mass destruction, known as Site 555, arrived to Poland in 2004 with his family as a refugee and is living and working in the Eastern European country since.

The scientist, known as Doctor Z, who lived in Bagdad at the outbreak of the Iraq War in March 2003, was involved in a uranium-enrichment project. Site 555 British intelligence services and others alleged was the site of a top-secret project initiated in the 1980s, directed by Saddam Hussein himself. The project was said to have gathered Iraq's top scientists together to work on the developing an arsenal of chemical and atomic weaponry. The scientists were privy to vast amounts of information and worked closely with the Iraqi dictator. Site 555 project was verified by the Polish Military Information Services, specifically by a code-breaker known as LYHUNT/103.

Gordon Brown issued an unequivocal apology last night on behalf of the government to Alan Turing, the second world war codebreaker who took his own life 55 years ago after being sentenced to chemical castration for being gay.

Describing Turing's treatment as "horrifying" and "utterly unfair", Brown said the country owed the brilliant mathematician a huge debt. He was proud, he said, to offer an official apology. "We're sorry, you deserved so much better," Brown writes in a statement posted on the No 10 website.

Turing is most famous for his work in helping create the "bombe" that cracked messages enciphered with the German Enigma machines. He was convicted of gross indecency in 1952 after admitting a sexual relationship with a man.
