Counterterrorism: Shifting from 'Who' to 'How'

As STRATFOR has noted for several years now, with al Qaeda's structure under continual attack and no regional al Qaeda franchise groups in the Western Hemisphere, the most pressing jihadist threat to the U.S. homeland at present stems from grassroots jihadists, not the al Qaeda core. This trend has been borne out by the large number of plots and arrests over the past several years, to include several so far in 2009. The grassroots have likewise proven to pose a critical threat to Europe (although it is important to note that the threat posed by grassroots operatives is more widespread, but normally involves smaller, less strategic attacks than those conducted by the al Qaeda core).

From a counterterrorism perspective, the problem posed by grassroots operatives is that unless they somehow self-identify by contacting a government informant or another person who reports them to authorities, attend a militant training camp, or conduct electronic correspondence with a person or organization under government scrutiny, they are very difficult to detect.

The threat posed by grassroots operatives, and the difficulty identifying them, highlight the need for counterterrorism programs to adopt a proactive, protective intelligence approach to the problem -- an approach that focuses on "the how" of militant attacks instead of just "the who."

Hamas has rockets capable of striking Tel Aviv: Israeli intelligence

The Islamic Hamas movement operatives in the Gaza Strip possess in their military arsenal rockets that are capable of striking Tel Aviv, a senior Israeli military intelligence officer warned on Tuesday in Jerusalem.

Major General Amos Yadlin, head of Military Intelligence for the Israel Defense Forces (IDF), made the warning while addressing the Knesset (parliament) Foreign Affairs and Defense Committee, saying that Hamas has recently tested a rocket capable of reaching targets at a distance of 60 km, which means the Tel Aviv area is under threat of rocket fire from Gaza. The rocket was fired into the Mediterranean Sea, Yadlin was quoted by local

daily Ha'aretz as telling lawmakers, though he did not say whether the weapon was manufactured in Gaza or was smuggled into the Strip from abroad.

This latest development is indicative of Hamas' growing military capabilities, said the intelligence officer.

CD shows Israel negotiated with 26/11 terrorists

Details of negotiations and phone conversations between 26/11 terrorists at Nariman House in Mumbai and the Israeli Embassy in Washington were revealed at the Mumbai special court on Tuesday.

The court heard a CD of telephone conversations between the terrorists who attacked Mumbai in November 2008 and Israeli officials. So was Israel negotiating or buying time? The court heard clear evidence that Israeli officials had tried to negotiate for the release of several hostages inside the Jewish Chabad House during the 26/11 attacks.

Obama's state secrets

When Attorney General Eric Holder invoked the "state secrets" privilege to quash a lawsuit alleging illegal National Security Agency spying last Friday night, his department's lawyers sounded a lot like those who worked for President George W. Bush.

In fact, they justified the action by filing an affidavit from President Obama's director of national intelligence that is nearly identical to one filed by President Bush's intelligence director two years ago.

The strikingly similar affidavit-making the same arguments in the almost exactly the same language-is among the strongest examples yet of how Obama administration officials are adopting Bush-era secrecy positions in major national security cases.

Obama Strengthens Independence & Power of Intel Advisory Groups

President Obama signed an executive order Wednesday that strengthened the independence and the information gathering powers of the President's Intelligence Advisory Board (PIAB) and its five-member watchdog sub-component, the Intelligence Oversight Board (IOB).

The president wanted to have bipartisan leadership -- there has been criticism in the past that the PIAB is a political job filled with yes-men -- so the chairmanship was expanded, if the president so desires, into two co-chairs. This week, President Obama appointed as co-chairs former Sens. David Boren, D-Okla., and Chuck Hagel, R-Neb.

400,000 Names on FBI Terror Watch List

The number of unique names on the U.S. terror watch list totals 400,000, newly released FBI data reveals.

The Washington Post reported that during a 12-month period ending in March of this year, 1,600 people were nominated daily by the U.S. intelligence community to be put on the list due to 'reasonable suspicion.' Each day, 600 names were also reportedly asked to be removed and 4,800 records be modified.

FBI officials, however, said each suggestion "does not necessarily represent a new individual, but may instead involve an alias or name variant for a previously watchlisted person." The data, which also showed that less than 5 percent of people on the list were U.S. citizens or legal permanent residents, was provided to the Senate Judiciary Committee in September.

U.S. eyes "intent" of China's space programs

The U.S. military needs to deepen dialogue with China to better understand the intent of its space programs, a U.S. general said on Tuesday, after a Chinese commander announced plans to develop offensive military capabilities in space.

General Kevin Chilton, head of the Pentagon's Strategic Command which coordinates U.S. military operations in space, said China-watchers had been "absolutely amazed" by the country's advances in its space programs over the past decade.

China was "on a fast-track to improving capabilities" and is not alone in wanting to ramp up its operations in space, he said.

Intell stored and never seen by human eyes

For over thirty years now, most of the spy satellite photos the U.S. has obtained have been digital, broadcast to earth from space. This has gradually overloaded the ability of human analysts to thoroughly study all the data coming back. Since everything associated with spy satellites is highly classified, the problems with analysing, or even just storing, the huge quantities of data, have been largely hidden from view. But there are warehouses full of tapes (the easiest way to store digital data), some of them decades old, and never seen by human eyes. In the last decade, there's been a growing flood of data coming from closer to the ground. UAV, droid and security cam video, airborne reconnaissance (both photo and electronic) and even troops mounting vidcams on their vehicles (to see what they might have missed during a patrol). It's been a growing crises.

Russia's Military Intelligence Chief Warns of New War

Alexander Shliakhturov, chief of Russia's military intelligence (GRU), said on November 5 that he did not rule out that Georgia might again use force against breakaway South Ossetia and Abkhazia.

"The situation with Georgia remains tense because the current Georgian authorities do not only refuse to recognize the sovereignty of Abkhazia and South Ossetia, but are sparing no efforts to return these countries, which have already become independent, to their jurisdiction," he told Itar-Tass news agency.

"We need to add to this the unpredictability of policy pursued by the Georgian authorities led by Saakashvili, which may succumb to temptation to use force in order to tame obstinate republics as it happened last August," Shliakhturov said. "We do not rule out such a development."

Former KGB spy shot dead in Moscow

Detectives in Russia are investigating the murder of a former KGB agent who was gunned down in Moscow yesterday, in the latest contract killing on the streets of the Russian capital.

Shabtai von Kalmanovic, a businessman, concert promoter and former spy, died in a hail of bullets in the passenger seat of his luxury S500 Mercedes. His killers had waited for his car to stop at traffic lights - a classic assassin's tactic - before opening fire, hitting him 10 times. This morning police said there was no doubt that Kalmanovic had been the victim of a meticulous professional hit, carried out by two gunmen who fled the scene in an unmarked Lada Priora. His driver was injured in the shooting, which took place not far from Vladimir Putin's Moscow office.

Vladimir Markin, of the investigating committee of Russia's procurator, said forensic experts had recovered 19 bullets from the scene of the shooting, which was carried out at 4.40pm Moscow time yesterday. "There's no doubt this was a contract-style crime," Markin said. "At the moment we are working on several theories of his killing. But the most probable one is linked to his business activities."

Russia to use military force abroad only as last resort - Medvedev

Russia will use its Armed Forces outside the country only in extreme circumstances to protect Russian nationals, President Dmitry Medvedev said on Thursday.

"Such decisions will be made only when absolutely necessary," Medvedev said at a meeting with members of the upper house of Russia's parliament. "Our citizens must be protected in any part of the world, and they must feel protected by the state." He stressed that such decisions "must be set in law." The house will review on Friday amendments to a law on defense which expands the use of the Russian Armed Forces abroad in certain situations.

"Jewish terrorist" stirs fear of Israeli radicals

A self-confessed killer dubbed "The Jewish Terrorist" has shown how far settlers may go to stop Israel trading land for peace with Palestinians and the risks even lone attackers can pose to stability in a tinderbox region.

So concluded many Israelis as media devoted much of their newsprint and airtime this week to the arrest of Yaakov "Jack" Tytell, an American immigrant to a Jewish settlement in the occupied West Bank. Police said he had admitted killing two Arabs a decade ago and more recent attacks on Israeli leftists.

Analysts were quick to compare him to the right-wing Jew, angry at peace deals with the Palestinians, who assassinated Prime Minister Yitzhak Rabin 14 years ago this week. The jailed killer Yigal Amir remains a hero to thousands on the Israeli right. Many on the left believe hopes of peace died with Rabin.

Ex-intelligence chief who brokered inter-Korean accord dies

Lee Hu-rak, former head of South Korea's state intelligence agency known for a secret trip to North Korea in 1972 to broker a historic inter-Korean agreement, died Saturday of age-related causes, his family said. He was 85.

Lee, the right-hand man of late former President Park Chung-hee, served as director of the Korea Central Intelligence Agency from 1970-1973. He was notorious for oppressing dissidents against Park's iron-fisted rule. Park seized power through a coup in 1961 and ruled the country until 1979 when he was assassinated by another close confidant.

Lee secretly travelled to Pyongyang in 1972, where he met then North Korean leader Kim Il-sung to pave the way for a landmark inter-Korean agreement on the principles for reunification, named the "July 4 South-North Joint Communiqué."

Alleged War criminal : I'm victim of 'intelligence plot'

Liberia's former president Charles Taylor on Thursday blamed an "intelligence plot" involving the British government for the fact that he is standing trial for war crimes charges in The Hague.

"Everything that is being played out for your honours in this case is all based on an intelligence plot with key players, senior officials in governments and intelligence agencies," he told judges of the Special Court for Sierra Leone. "This is a careful orchestration for my destruction."

Taylor claimed it was organisations like private military company Sandline, not him, that brought arms into Liberia's neighbour Sierra Leone, where he is accused of having fuelled war by arming the rebel Revolutionary United Front (RUF) in exchange for so-called "blood diamonds".

Italian court finds CIA agents guilty of kidnapping terrorism suspect

Twenty-three Americans were tonight convicted of kidnapping by an Italian court at the end of the first trial anywhere in the world involving the CIA's "extraordinary rendition" programme for abducting terrorist suspects.

The former head of the CIA in Milan Robert Lady was given an eight-year jail sentence for his part in the seizure of Osama Moustafa Hassan Nasr, known as Abu Omar, who claimed that he was subsequently tortured in Egypt. Lady's superior, Jeff Castelli, the then head of the CIA in Italy, and two other Americans were acquitted on the grounds that they enjoyed diplomatic immunity.

But another 21 alleged CIA operatives and a US air force officer were each sentenced to five years in jail. All were tried in absentia and those who were convicted will be regarded as fugitives under Italian law.

Famed French judge Bruguiere tells of a troubled Pakistan

The Pakistani government has lost control of rogue military and intelligence officers who aid Al Qaeda and its allies and play a double game with the West, a renowned French judge asserts in an upcoming book.

For three decades, Jean-Louis Bruguiere was an investigative magistrate, a powerful role that combines the duties of prosecutor and judge and allowed him to cultivate high-level contacts from Algiers to Moscow. He stepped down from that post in 2007, and now serves as the European Union's envoy to Washington on issues related to the financing of terrorism.

France doubts Islamist role in Pakistan bomb

French secret service documents have cast doubt on a theory that Islamist militants were responsible for a 2002 bomb attack in Karachi that killed 11 French nationals, a source close to the case said on Monday.

The documents were declassified in October at the request of magistrates who will investigate the possibility that the attack was ordered by Pakistani soldiers angry with France over the non-payment of bribes tied to a defence deal. "The documents, which are all top secret, show strong scepticism of the Qaeda theory," the source said.

Karadzic told war crimes trial will go ahead

The presiding judge in Radovan Karadzic's war crimes and genocide trial has told the former Bosnian Serb leader he has no right to determine the start of his trial.

Mr Karadzic told the court in a preliminary hearing today, his first appearance since the trial began last week, that he was still not ready for the trial to begin, citing a wealth of prosecution and defence material to sift through. His trial in The Hague began last week without him in the dock, with the prosecution opening its case on Tuesday and throughout the remainder of the week.

The 64-year-old said it would be "criminal" if he participated in the trial now, saying he had 45,000 documents, 23,000 exhibits, vast numbers of witness testimonies, 1.3 million pages of material and 300 days of audio and visual testimony to trawl through.

September 2001 eingerichtet hatte, in Litauen befunden habe. Acht Terrorverdächtige wurden hier dem Bericht zufolge gefangen gehalten. Das Gefängnis nahe der Hauptstadt Vilnius sei im Jahr 2005 geschlossen worden.

Islamist radicals closely monitored by Albanian intell

A secret service official in Tirana told Balkan Insight online magazine that the activities of Albanian "Islamist radicals were being closely monitored as a serious threat to national security". SHISH has been closely cooperating with the United States CIA since 2001 attacks on the Pentagon and World Trade Center in identifying, locating, and monitoring Islamic activities in Albania.

On November 2, 2009, the day when Albania was hosting the Conference on Religious Tolerance, Albania authorities shut down an Islamic library in Tirana, as the city planners needed it for another project, wrote Ramiz Zekaj in KohaJone website.

According to confidential sources from the General Prosecutor's Office in Tirana, this library's has do with the arrest of Muhamed Abdullah, a Wahhabi imam, who was arrested by Albanian authorities on charges of terrorism, The Examiner reveals. A source from Rasim Hasanaj's Office of the State Committee of Cults, who asked to remain anonymous, opined that this library had to be closed because radical Islamic Wahhabies, both Albanians and foreign, were using this place to preach hatred and violence to young people. Moreover, she added that the funds to operate this library were coming from Saudi Arabia and other Arab nations, which have become a national security concern.

Dabei hörte der ABW auch Gespräche zwischen Sumlinski und anderen Journalisten mit, die nichts mit den Ermittlungen zu tun hatten und teilweise privater Natur waren. Statt das entsprechende Material zu vernichten, wie es laut "Rzeczpospolita" gesetzlich vorgeschrieben ist, bewahrte es der Geheimdienst auf und stellte es dem ABW-Vizechef Jacek Maka für einen Zivilprozess gegen die Zeitung zur Verfügung.

Cyberattacks traced to NKorea

The North Korean government was the source of high-profile cyberattacks in July that caused Web outages in South Korea and the United States, news reports said Friday.

The IP address – the Web equivalent of a street address or phone number – that triggered the Web attacks was traced back to North Korea's Ministry of Post and Telecommunications, the chief of South Korea's main spy agency reportedly told lawmakers. The ministry leased the IP address from China, Won Sei-hoon of the National Intelligence Service told lawmakers Thursday, according to JoongAng Ilbo newspaper. South Korea's Yonhap news agency carried a similar report.

The spy agency declined to confirm the reports. Two lawmakers on parliament's intelligence committee contacted Friday also refused to confirm the reports. The Unification Ministry, which monitors North Korea, said it cannot comment on intelligence matters.

The North Korean Menace

South Korea recently uncovered a North Korean plot to obtain South Korean electronic warfare equipment. North Korean agents, operating in China, sought to connect with South Korean business and government officials travelling in China, in order to see who could be bribed to help obtain the desired equipment. As a result of this, South Korea again warned their citizens, especially those working for the government or defense firms, to be careful who they deal with in China.

To emphasize the danger, the government also announced the arrest of a former army officer, only identified as Mr. Lee, who had been handing over military information to the North Koreans for the last seventeen years. In return, the spy had been paid \$50,600. Lee was in India, studying political science at the University of Delhi, when he was first approached by North Korean agents in 1992. Lee then made numerous trips overseas, where he met his North Korean contacts, and turned over CDs full of data.

Schwedischer Geheimdienst FRA wird DDoS-Opfer

Die schwedische Försvarets Radioanstalt (FRA), der "technische Geheimdienst" des skandinavischen Landes, wurde zu Beginn dieser Woche Opfer massiver DDoS-Angriffe.

Bekannt wurde die Behörde vor allem durch die Einführung des sogenannten FRA-Gesetzes im Sommer vergangenen Jahres. Dieses erlaubt der FRA, den gesamten Datenverkehr, der von Schweden aus ins Ausland geht (oder umgekehrt) mitzulesen, und sorgte unter Datenschützern, Bürgerrechtlern und Verfechtern der Netzneutralität für massive Kritik. Nach Angaben der Sicherheitsfirma F-Secure wurde mit dem Monitoring im letzten Monat begonnen. Ob die Angriffe womöglich aus diesem Grund, als eine Art Rache, durchgeführt wurden? Womöglich könnten dann russische Cyberkriminelle hinter den Angriffen stecken, deren Traffic zu einem großen Teil über Schweden geht. Auch "Hacktivisten" könnten aus Rache gegen die Überwachung durch die FRA durchaus zum Botnet gegriffen haben. Zu den Verdächtigen zählen aber auch Fans der Filesharing-Seite The Pirate Bay, gegen die die FRA in der Vergangenheit vorgegangen war.

The top threat in enterprise environments during the first half of the year was the Conficker worm, Microsoft says in its Security Intelligence Report (SIRv7), which covers the first six months of 2009.

According to SIRv7, the number of worm infections in enterprise environments -- those running Forefront Client Security -- doubled from the last half of 2008 through the first half of 2009. During this period, worms rose from fifth most commonly encountered threat category to the second.

Former Soviet Officials Reveal U.S. Strategic Intelligence Failure

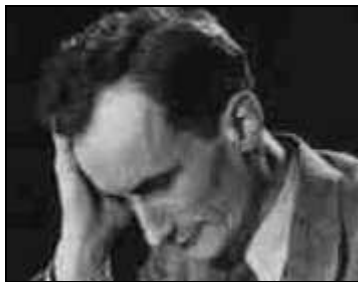
1995 Contractor Study Finds that U.S. Analysts Exaggerated Soviet Aggressiveness and Understated Moscow's Fears of a U.S. First Strike: During a 1972 command post exercise, leaders of the Kremlin listened to a briefing on the results of a hypothetical war with the United States. A U.S. attack would kill 80 million Soviet citizens and destroy 85 percent of the country's industrial capacity. According to the recollections of a

Soviet general who was present, General Secretary Leonid Brezhnev "trembled" when he was asked to push a button, asking Soviet defense minister Grechko "this is definitely an exercise?" This story appears in a recently released two-volume study on Soviet Intentions, 1965-1985, prepared in 1995 by the Pentagon contractor BDM Corporation, and published today for the first time by the National Security Archive. Based on an extraordinarily revealing series of interviews with former senior Soviet defense officials--"unhappy Cold Warriors"--during the final days of the Soviet Union, the BDM study puts Soviet nuclear policy in a fresh light by highlighting Soviet leaders' recognition of the catastrophe of nuclear conflict, even while they supported preparations for fighting an unsurvivable war.

Shaun Wylie: member of Bletchley Park code-breaking team, died



Shaun Wylie, mathematician and code-breaker, was born on January 17, 1913. He died on October 2, 2009, aged 96.

The mathematician Shaun Wylie was one of the leading members of the Bletchley Park code-breaking team of the Second World War as well as one of its last survivors. While in Princeton, Wylie had met the British mathematician Alan Turing (1912-54). When war was declared in 1939 Turing joined the mathematical team of the Government Code and Cypher School at Bletchley Park, working on deciphering German military radio traffic. In late 1940 Turing invited Wylie to join him. In February 1941 Wylie joined Turing's team in Hut 8, working on the Enigma machine used by the German Navy. In the words of Hugh Alexander, Turing's successor as head of Hut 8, "except for Turing, no one made a bigger contribution to the success of Hut 8 than Wylie; he was easily the best all-rounder in the section, astonishingly quick and resourceful and contributed a great deal to theory and practice in a number of different directions".

Wylie was a modest man, of great human warmth. When asked whether he had any regrets, he replied: "I wish I'd been a better mathematician." His wife Odette predeceased him, as did their eldest son. He is survived by two sons and a daughter.

The Nuclear Emergency Search Team (NEST), 1974-1996

Declassified Documents Depict Creation, Capabilities, And Activities of Once-Secret Nuclear Counterterrorism Unit. The U.S. government's secret nuclear bomb squad evaluated more than 100 nuclear extortion threats and incidents between 1974 and 1996 but only a dozen required actual deployments (the others were hoaxes). The Nuclear Emergency Search Team (NEST) had the capacity in 1996 of deploying up to 600 people and over 150 tons of equipment to an incident site, but all deployments to that point had been much smaller (a maximum of 45 people), according to the documents. A subsequent Web posting will cover the NEST from 1997 through the present.

Managed by the Nevada Operations Office of the Department of Energy (and its predecessors), NEST drew personnel from key national laboratories - Los Alamos, Sandia, Livermore - and their contractors. On an everyday basis NEST personnel worked in a multitude of areas - including weapons design, diagnostics, health physics, and information technology - and were called into action for exercises or actual deployments.

The exhibition premiere took place on April 7, 2009 at the Permanent Representation of the Czech Republic to the European Union in Brussels, where it was on view through the end of that month within the scope of the Czech Republic's presidency of the EU Council.

In conjunction with this project, the Institute has released an eponymous book featuring a more comprehensive selection of these never before published photographs taken in the course of secret police during the "normalization" era of hard-line socialist entrenchment after the 1968 Soviet-led occupation of Czechoslovakia. In addition, the book offers readers a selection of detailed introductory and scholarly texts addressing the nature of the photographs' origin and related technical details.
