**China: Google steckt mit US-Geheimdienst unter einer Decke**

(AFP) Die chinesischen Staatsmedien haben den US-Internetriesen Google nach seinem Rückzug aus China scharf angegriffen und dem Unternehmen eine Zusammenarbeit mit dem US-Geheimdienst vorgeworfen. Für die Chinesen sei Google "nicht Gott", hieß es in der "Volkszeitung", dem Sprachrohr der herrschenden Kommunistischen Partei.

In Bezug auf Werte sei auch Google nicht "unschuldig". Schließlich sei die Zusammenarbeit des Unternehmens mit den US-Geheim- und Sicherheitsdiensten allgemein bekannt, hieß es in einem Kommentar in der Auslandsausgabe der Zeitung. Die englischsprachige "Global Times" wertete Googles Rückzug vom chinesischen Markt als "großen strategischen Fehltritt".

Google hatte am Montag nach monatelangem Streit über Hackerangriffe und Zensurbestimmungen in China die Selbstzensur seiner chinesischen Seiten für beendet erklärt. Die Besucher der chinesischen Suchmaschine google.cn werden künftig auf Google-Server in Hongkong umgeleitet. Die chinesische Regierung wertete die Entscheidung als "völlig falsch".

**Jihadism: The Grassroots Paradox**

(STRATFOR) Last week, rumors that Adam Gadahn had been arrested in Karachi, Pakistan, quickly swept through the global media. When the dust settled, it turned out that the rumors were incorrect; the person arrested was not the American-born al Qaeda spokesman. The excitement generated by the rumors overshadowed a message from Gadahn that the al Qaeda media arm as Sahab had released on March 7, the same day as the reported arrest. While many of the messages from al Qaeda figures that as Sahab has released over the past several years have been repetitive and quite unremarkable, after watching Gadahn's March 7 message, we believe that it is a message too interesting to ignore.

**Gates says reviewing contractors' role in intel gathering**

(Reuters) The Pentagon announced last week it was investigating "serious allegations" about a Defense Department employee who may have secretly channeled money to an off-the-books spy operation aimed at hunting militants.

Gates did not comment on those allegations specifically. But asked more broadly about allowing contractors to collect intelligence on the battlefield, Gates said: "Quite frankly, in principle, I would have concerns about that."

"But I don't know enough to know whether it took place, and, if so, whether there was value added," he told reporters.

The accusations, first detailed in a New York Times report, centered on Michael D. Furlong, who the newspaper said hired contractors from private security companies that employed former CIA and Special Forces operatives.

Although his program was meant to provide U.S. commanders with details of Afghanistan's social and tribal landscape, the contractors gathered intelligence on the whereabouts of suspected militants and the location of insurgent camps, the Times reported.

**Ex-spies still agitated over CIA's Afghan losses**

(Washington Post) Nearly three months after an al-Qaeda double agent obliterated an important CIA team in Afghanistan, veteran spies remain agitated over the incident and the agency's seeming inability to fix longtime operational flaws.

The latest eruption over the Dec. 30 incident that killed seven CIA officers and contractors in a powerful suicide fireball comes from Robert Baer, the former clandestine operations officer who has been pillorying his former employer in books, articles and television interviews since shortly after the Sept. 11, 2001, attacks. But other agency veterans have been weighing in as well, and increasingly, on the record.

Writing in the April issue of GQ magazine, (b) Baer depicts a spy agency where "the operatives' sun started to set" in the 1990s and never recovered. So it was that the spy agency sent an analyst to do an operative's work in Khost, in desolate southeast Afghanistan, last year. Traditionally, the CIA's station chiefs, or top agency officer in a country, and its base chiefs, deployed in outlying offices, were veteran case officers, or seasoned spy handlers.

**'Jihad Jane' On Trial For Terror Recruitment**

(SkyNews) Colleen LaRose appeared in a Pennsylvania courtroom for the first time to face accusations of conspiracy to provide material support to terrorists.

The 46-year-old allegedly sought out male and female recruits, raised money and agreed to murder a Swedish cartoonist. The indictment against her says she pledged that "only death will stop me". The petite blonde, who had her hair in dreadlocks and a ponytail, smiled and appeared relaxed during the 10-minute hearing.

The prosecution alleges that LaRose recruited women who had passports and the ability to travel to and around Europe in support of violent jihad.

**FBI cautious on rules for terrorism questioning**

(Reuters) Some Republican lawmakers have questioned whether critical information was lost because the intelligence community was not present for interviews of a Nigerian man who tried to blow up a U.S. airliner on Christmas Day with a bomb hidden in his underwear.

Mueller said interviews often must happen quickly and getting the investigators who are specialists in certain subjects can take hours because they are hundreds of miles away, as was the case in the Christmas Day bombing attempt. "We were dealing with on that day the necessity to respond, and within very few moments, to get the information that we thought was essential," Mueller told a House Appropriations subcommittee reviewing the FBI's fiscal 2011 budget request.

Authorities at the time were concerned the Nigerian man might have been part of a broader plot involving additional people carrying bombs on other planes.

**Defense official says Afghan program was authorized**

(Washington Post) Michael D. Furlong, the senior Defense Department employee under investigation for allegedly running an unauthorized intelligence-gathering operation in Afghanistan, says his now-suspended program was fully authorized by top U.S. military commanders.

According to Furlong, the program, which began in late 2008, was requested by Army Gen. David D. McKiernan, the former top U.S. commander in Afghanistan, and approved by the U.S. Central Command.

In an interview with the San Antonio Express News published Thursday, he said McKiernan asked him to provide information "that would enhance our understanding of the environment" in the Afghanistan and Pakistan war zones. He denied misusing any U.S. contract funds.

The program was shut down and an investigation begun by the Defense Department's inspector general late last year after complaints by the CIA and a finding by senior officials under the new Afghanistan commander, Gen. Stanley A. McChrystal, that Furlong had stepped outside the boundaries of his contract and the law and "didn't want to operate within the constraints of how we do business," according to a U.S. military official familiar with the situation who was not authorized to discuss it on the record.

**Michael D. Furlong gives interview**

(My san Antonio) As he bats down allegations that he ran an off-the-books spy operation in Afghanistan and Pakistan, a civilian Defense Department official has been locked out of his office at Lackland AFB and remains cautious about who visits him at his San Antonio apartment.

In interviews Tuesday and Wednesday with the San Antonio Express-News, Michael D. Furlong, 56, said a report earlier this week in the New York Times incorrectly portrayed the now-suspended program he ran.

He denied allegations that he inappropriately diverted millions of dollars for the operation and said his military superiors approved the program, which at one point was supervised by U.S. commanders and a separate NATO command.

Furlong is accused of using civilian subcontractors to secretly collect information that later was used to target and kill suspected militants.

**Yemen-American imam calls for US Muslim revolt**

(AP) A Yemeni-American Muslim preacher has called on American Muslims to turn against the U.S. government because of its actions against Muslims around the world.

Anwar Awlaki released a new audio message according to the SITE Intelligence Group on Wednesday. Parts of the English-language message were aired on CNN. Awlaki was known to be in touch with the American Muslim Army major accused of killing 13 people in Texas as well as a Nigerian who attempted to destroy an airliner in Detroit on Christmas day. His English language sermons are generally targeted at American Muslims whom he says should not be loyal "to a government leading a war against Muslims."

Awlaki is believed to be residing in Yemen.

**The First Amendment and "Newsgathering Crimes"**

(FAS) It might be pleasant for writers and publishers to suppose that First Amendment principles of freedom of speech and freedom of the press are absolute and will prevail in every circumstance. But that is clearly not the case.

For one thing, the Supreme Court has specifically excluded obscenity, child pornography, and certain other forms of communication from First Amendment protections. (See "Freedom of Speech and Press: Exceptions to the First Amendment", Congressional Research Service, updated October 16, 2009.) Moreover, courts have repeatedly upheld the constitutionality of prohibitions in the Espionage Act against the unauthorized disclosure of certain types of classified information (most recently in a 2006 ruling in the AIPAC case, USA v. Rosen and Weissman).

**US Judge: If You Leak Classified Info, Take the Consequences**

(FAS) Leaking classified information to an unauthorized person may be the right thing to do in certain circumstances, suggested Judge T.S. Ellis, III of the Eastern District of Virginia in a newly released hearing transcript from last year. In particular, he said, leaking may be an acceptable move if the leaker accepts full responsibility for his actions.

Ordinarily, disclosing classified information to an unauthorized person is deemed unethical, if one has signed a non-disclosure agreement not to do so. It may also be illegal, if the classified information falls within certain categories whose unauthorized disclosure is proscribed by law (including communications intelligence-related information, identities of covert agents, nuclear weapons design information, and "national defense information").

"Whistleblowing" in itself is not an adequate rationale for leaking classified information, Judge Ellis said. "Simply because you believe that something that's going on that's classified should be revealed to the press and to the public, so that the public can know that its government is doing something you think is wrong, that doesn't justify [publicly disclosing] it.... Noble motives don't erase the violation."

However, he said, "you may want to go ahead and do it [anyway], but you have to stand up and take the consequences."

**U.S. aviation security pick favors Israeli model**

(Washington Post) President Barack Obama's nominee to oversee security at U.S. airports said on Tuesday he wants to shift screening closer to the Israeli model to include more behavior detection in a bid to thwart terrorism plots.

Retired Major General Robert Harding was nominated earlier this month to head the Transportation Security Administration after serving more than



three decades in the military, including a stint as deputy to the Army's chief of intelligence and director for operations in the Defense Intelligence Agency.

Aviation security has received heightened attention in recent months after a Nigerian man tried to blow up a U.S. commercial airliner flying from Amsterdam to Detroit last Christmas with a bomb hidden in his underwear.

#### **Israeli supermarket parodies Dubai assassination in TV advert**

(Times Online) "Mossad mania" continued in Israel this week when a supermarket chain filmed a television commercial inspired by the assassination of a Hamas commander in Dubai.



The commercials for the Mahsaney Kimat Hinam (Almost Free Warehouse) chain shows actors carrying tennis rackets and wearing hats, glasses and wigs – the same disguises worn by the alleged killers in surveillance images released by Dubai police – as they make their way along store aisles.

The actors are seen through the supermarket security cameras surreptitiously slipping products into their shopping trolley. One actor wearing a tennis outfit browses the frozen food section while an actress wearing a wide-brimmed floppy hat mimics Israel's policy of neither confirming nor denying involvement in the assassination, saying she "couldn't admit to anything".

The advertisement even carries the slogans "Eliminate the prices" and "We offer killer prices".

#### **Anklage gegen Spione Israels im Libanon**

(Kleine Zeitung) Vor einem libanesischen Militärtribunal ist gegen vier weitere Personen Anklage wegen Spionage für Israel erhoben worden, wie aus Justizkreisen in Beirut am Montag verlautete. Zwei der Angeklagten befinden sich in Haft, die beiden anderen sind auf der Flucht. Sie sollen sich nach Angaben eines Verhafteten inzwischen in Israel aufhalten.

Im Vorjahr hatten die libanesischen Behörden die Zerschlagung eines vom israelischen Auslandsgeheimdienstes Mossad aufgezogenen Spionagerings gemeldet. Insgesamt sind seither rund siebzig Personen wegen Hochverrats und "Kollaboration mit dem Feind" angeklagt worden.

Die Gruppe soll Anschläge insbesondere auf Vertreter der schiitischen Hisbollah sowie pro-syrischer Palästinenserfraktionen vorbereitet haben. Als Kopf des Spionagerings gilt der pensionierte General Adib el-Alam. Im Februar wurde ein 63-jähriger früherer Unteroffizier wegen Mitwirkung an einem Anschlag auf zwei Führer des "Islamischen Jihad" zum Tode verurteilt. Er hatte gestanden, vom israelischen Geheimdienst mehrere Tausend US-Dollar erhalten zu haben.

**Britain's expulsion of Israeli diplomat damage counterterrorism**

(Jerusalem Post) Britain's expulsion of an Israeli diplomat over the alleged Mossad assassination of Hamas arch-terrorist Mahmoud al-Mabhouh is being seen by security experts in Israel as a politically-motivated overreaction that seems certain to damage counterterrorism intelligence-sharing between London and Jerusalem.

UK media outlets reported on Monday that the diplomat who will likely be asked to leave is the head of the Mossad station in London. If the reports are accurate, the expulsion would result in the removal of an important channel of communication between the Mossad and Britain's security services, one that has provided London with valuable information on developments in Middle Eastern arenas such as Iraq.

"Al-Qaida views Britain as the head of a Western snake and an immediate target. It's not very smart to kick out a representative of a foreign intelligence agency that is helping you," former senior Mossad member Rami Igra told The Jerusalem Post on Tuesday.

Britain, itself involved in a global struggle against terrorism, "went too far, and this lacks foresight," Igra added. Israel has "more to offer than receive" in intelligence sharing with Britain, he said

**Planespotter accused of spying from a hotel sunbed in Egypt**

(Daily Mail) A planespotter was arrested in Egypt after being accused of spying from his hotel sunlounger.

Corbie Weastell was thrown in a filthy cell without food or water and left handcuffed and chained to other inmates. He was freed two days later after being brought before a court and thrown out of the country.

The case of the builder, from Bishop Auckland, Co Durham, comes only days after two planespotters were arrested in India, only to be freed after several days in a detention centre. Security forces in both Egypt and India are in a state of increased vigilance over the threat of Islamic terrorism.

**U.S. intelligence: Al Qaeda may target ships off Yemen**

(CNN) Military and commercial maritime traffic sailing off the coast of Yemen are being warned by U.S. intelligence they may be targeted by al Qaeda.

The U.S. Navy's Office of Naval Intelligence has posted a warning to mariners and military ships that "information suggests that al-Qaeda remains interested in maritime attacks."

The notice covers the waters of the Bab-al-Mandeb Strait, Red Sea, and the Gulf of Aden along the coast of Yemen.

The notice issued by the U.S. Department of Transportation and posted by the ONI says "although it is unclear how they would proceed, it may be similar in nature to the attacks against the USS COLE in October 2000, and the M/V LIMBURG in October 2002 where a small to mid-size boat laden with explosives was detonated."

**U.S. top intel official meets Indian home minister over terrorism**

Shortly after the meeting, U.S. Ambassador to India Timothy J Roemer, who accompanied Blair, said that the United States is trying to ensure an hour to hour and minute to minute cooperation with India in fighting the common enemy.

**The ECHR Judgment in Sejdic & Finci versus Bosnia & Herzegovina**

(ISF) The Constitution of Bosnia and Herzegovina which is a peace agreement between Bosnia and Herzegovina, the Republic of Croatia and the former Federal Republic of Yugoslavia makes distinction between two categories of citizens: "constituent peoples": Bosniaks, Croats and Serbs) on the one hand and "others" on the other: Jews, Roma and other national minorities together with those who do not declare themselves to be affiliated with any ethnic group. The constitution also states that the House of Peoples of the Parliamentary Assembly and the Presidency are composed only of citizens belonging to the three constituent peoples - excluding Jews and Roma as "others" national minorities. According to Article V of the Constitution, the Presidency of Bosnia and Herzegovina shall consist of one Bosniak, one Croat and one Serb. The House of Peoples of the Parliament of Bosnia and Herzegovina, according to Article IV of the Constitution, includes fifteen delegates, two-thirds from the Federation (that is five Croats and five Bosniaks) and one-third from the Republika Srpska (five Serbs).

**Another Mossad assassination, this time in Hungary?**

(Intelnews.org) IntelNews got word last night that an unidentified Syrian man was shot dead in Budapest early on Wednesday morning, as he was driving his car. Witnesses reported that the assailant stole a small black briefcase from the 52-year-old victim's vehicle, before fleeing the scene of the crime on foot. A few hours later, it emerged that, in the week prior to the mysterious shooting, Hungarian air controllers located two Israeli Gulfstream spy planes hovering over the Hungarian capital, close to the airport, where Wednesday's shooting actually occurred.

The Hungarian government is so far refusing to release precise information as to the identity of the Syrian victim in Wednesday's shooting. The country's Ministry of Defense has also refused comment on the Israeli spy planes, except to say that they were "on a diplomatic mission". Meanwhile, Aliza Bin-Noun, Israel's ambassador to Hungary, denied the Gulfstream aircraft were in any way collecting intelligence. She also alleged that the two Israeli Air Force planes were on a "routine" mission and had received permission to enter Hungarian national airspace from the Hungarian National Transport Authority. Watch this space for further updates. (a)

In Turkey, meanwhile, the country's Air Forces Command confirmed that the two Israeli jets had requested and received permission to transit through Turkish airspace. However, in accordance with Turkish aeronautical regulations, the airplanes were allowed to fly through Turkey "on condition of using air corridors in Turkish airspace; of not refueling midair and of not being equipped with electronic apparatuses intended for photography, exploration and intelligence" (emphasis added). This means that, if the Israeli Gulfstream aircraft were indeed engaging in airborne surveillance, as many in Hungary suspect, they will have broken Turkish, in addition to Hungarian law. (b)

### **Amnesty accuses UK of 'grave' human rights violations**

-----

(Guardian) The British government is today accused of involvement in a catalogue of "grave human rights violations" since the September 2001 al-Qaida attacks, in a report published by Amnesty International.

In the most damning Amnesty report on the UK's human rights record for a generation, the organisation says there is "credible evidence" that the government is implicated in torture, unlawful detentions, rendition, the concealment of victims' complaints and a failure to disclose evidence of torture.

Its publication comes 24 hours after an alliance of human rights groups and MPs, including Amnesty, Liberty and the New York-based Human Rights Watch, wrote a joint letter to the British media demanding an independent inquiry into the UK's role in torture and rendition.

In a sign of growing turmoil within government over the issue, last Thursday it was decided to shelve publication of a rewritten interrogation policy for MI5 and MI6 officers questioning suspects overseas - something Gordon Brown promised a year ago on the grounds that he believed "it is right that parliament and the public should know what those involved in interviewing detainees can and cannot do".

### **British military intelligence 'ran renegade torture unit in Iraq'**

-----

(The Independent) Fresh evidence has emerged that British military intelligence ran a secret operation in Iraq which authorised degrading and unlawful treatment of prisoners. Documents reveal that prisoners were kept hooded for long periods in intense heat and deprived of sleep by defence intelligence officers. They also reveal that officers running the operation claimed to be answerable only "directly to London".

The revelations will further embarrass the British government, which last month was forced to release documents showing it knew that UK resident and terror suspect Binyam Mohamed had been tortured in Pakistan.

The latest documents emerged during the inquiry into Baha Mousa, an Iraqi hotel worker beaten to death while in the custody of British troops in September 2003. The inquiry is looking into how interrogation techniques banned by the Government in 1972 and considered torture and degrading treatment were used again in Iraq.

**Government defends use of foreign intelligence**

(Reuters) Britain on Wednesday defended its use of intelligence obtained by foreign security agencies from terrorism suspects, even when it could not be sure how the informants had been treated.

"We cannot get all the intelligence we need from our own sources, because the terrorist groups we face are around the world, and our resources are finite," the Foreign Office said in an annual report on human rights.

"So we must work with intelligence and security agencies overseas. Some of them share our standards and laws while others do not. But we cannot afford the luxury of only dealing with those that do. The intelligence we get from others saves British lives." The government lost a legal battle last month to prevent the disclosure of U.S. intelligence material relating to allegations of "cruel and inhuman" treatment of British resident Binyam Mohamed by the CIA, leading to accusations that domestic spy agency MI5 knew about the use of such methods.

**UK delays new guidelines for spies, soldiers**

(AP) New British guidelines on handling terrorism suspects held overseas have been delayed over a dispute about how to deal with potentially life-saving information from detainees who may be at risk of torture by allies.

Prime Minister Gordon Brown promised a year ago that new rules would be drawn up, and the government was expected to make them public for the first time on Thursday. But officials have acknowledged the document won't appear before the country's national election, due within three months.

Brown ordered the rules to be rewritten following accusations that British officials were complicit in the torture of terror suspects held overseas by other nations, including the United States. Police are investigating two cases related to the actions of intelligence officers from the MI5 and MI6 spy agencies.

Two government officials, who demanded anonymity to discuss the issue, said Britain's government and Parliament's intelligence oversight committee disagree over a section of the new rules dealing with how ministers should handle material gleaned from suspects who may be at risk of mistreatment.

Die zirka 50 Kisten seien 1993 tatsächlich von BND-Leuten im damaligen Geräte- und Werkzeugbau Wiesa bei Annaberg-Buchholz abgeholt worden, informierte ein für den Bereich Nachrichtendienste zuständiger Mitarbeiter des Kanzleramtes.

Die Wieger sollte die Geheimwaffe der DDR bei der Devisenbeschaffung werden. Um weltmarktfähig zu sein, war das Sturmgewehr für Nato-Patronen entwickelt worden. 1989 hatte es alle Härtetests bestanden. "Die Wieger schoss bei minus 60 Grad Celsius ebenso zuverlässig wie bei plus 50 Grad", berichtete ein ehemals leitender Mitarbeiter des Wiesaer Rüstungsbetriebs der "Freien Presse". "Wir haben sie mit Sand berieselt, ohne dass sie verklemmte. Bei der Truppenerprobung in Peru und Indien ließ die Wieger auch in Sachen Präzision Sturmgewehre aus den USA und Westdeutschland weit hinter sich."

Doch ehe die Serienfertigung begann, kam die Wende und das Werk in Wiesa wurde auf zivile Produktion umgestellt. Unter Treuhandverwaltung stehend musste der Betrieb die Pläne, Lehren und Werkzeuge für die Wieger herausgeben. Laut Übergabeprotokoll gingen diese an ein Militärarchiv in München.

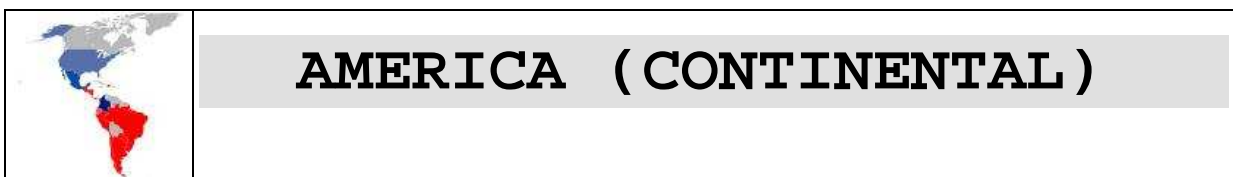

**Queensland Government throws \$14m at phone tapping**

(ZDNet) The Queensland Government has given the state's Crime and Misconduct Commission (CMC) funding to run an independent phone-tapping unit from 1 July.

The state government allocated \$14 million over five years to the CMC for telecommunications interception, including \$605,000 this financial year to implement the system. The phone surveillance system will be established in co-operation with the Australian Crime Commission.

The funding will allow the CMC to use telephone interception powers in three main operational areas: corruption and serious misconduct; organised crime such as drug trafficking, extortion and fraud; and pedophilia and child sex offences. Last year, state parliament passed the Telecommunications Interception Act 2009 (PDF), which meant the state's crime-fighting bodies can intercept telephone calls within a framework that also has strict civil liberties and compliance safeguards.

**New Zealand : 'External' spies turn focus on home front**

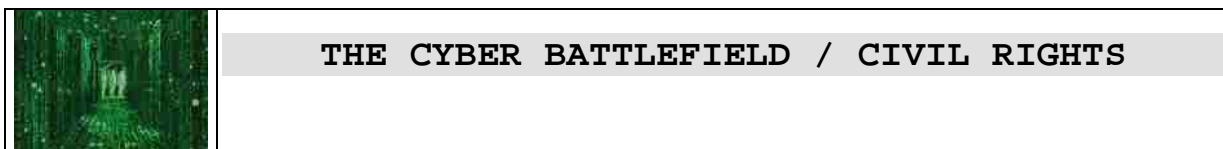
(The Dominion Post) Domestic security threats will be more closely examined by a reformed government intelligence bureau.

The External Assessments Bureau announced on its website that it has been renamed the National Assessments Bureau. The Green Party says this is a "huge change", creating a "domestic spy agency" that should have been subject to Parliament's scrutiny.

The name change marks a change of emphasis for the bureau, with more work being done on intelligence within New Zealand. The staff and budget have not increased from the existing 30 people and \$3.5 million.

The change follows a review of the Government's three security services by former foreign affairs secretary Simon Murdoch. Besides the new bureau, the Government also relies on the Security Intelligence Service (SIS) and the Government Communications Security Bureau for intelligence.

**Dismantling of Saudi-CIA Web site: Need for clearer cyberwar policies**

(Washington Post) By early 2008, top U.S. military officials had become convinced that extremists planning attacks on American forces in Iraq were making use of a Web site set up by the Saudi government and the CIA to uncover terrorist plots in the kingdom.

"We knew we were going to be forced to shut this thing down," recalled one former civilian official, describing tense internal discussions in which military commanders argued that the site was putting Americans at risk. "CIA resented that," the former official said.

Elite U.S. military computer specialists, over the objections of the CIA, mounted a cyberattack that dismantled the online forum. Although some Saudi officials had been informed in advance about the Pentagon's plan, several key princes were "absolutely furious" at the loss of an intelligence-gathering tool, according to another former U.S. official.

**Naming and Shaming 'Bad' ISPs**

(KrebsonSecurity) Roughly two years ago, I began an investigation that sought to chart the baddest places on the Internet, the red light districts of the Web, if you will. What I found in the process was that many security experts, companies and private researchers also were gathering this intelligence, but that few were publishing it. Working with several other researchers, I collected and correlated mounds of data, and published what I could verify in The Washington Post. The subsequent unplugging of malware and spammer-friendly ISPs Atrivo and then McColo in late 2008 showed what can happen when the Internet community collectively highlights centers of badness online.

**AVprofit: Rogue AV + Zeus = \$**

(KrebsonSecurity) The presence of rogue anti-virus products, also known as scareware, on a Microsoft Windows computer is often just the most visible symptom of a more serious and insidious system-wide infection. To understand why, it helps to take a peek inside some of the more popular

rogue anti-virus distribution networks that are paying people to peddle scareware alongside far more invasive threats.

Distributors or "affiliates" who sign up with avprofit.com, for example, are given access to an installer program that downloads not only rogue anti-virus but also ZeuS, a stealthy piece of malware that specializes in mining online banking credentials from infected PCs. ZeuS is the very piece of malware directly responsible for helping thieves steal tens of millions of dollars from small to mid-sized businesses over the past year.

**Cyber-Vulnerabilities: American Grid, Chinese Grip**

(StrategyPage) The U.S. fears for its grid; China's communist government worries about its grip.

That is the strategic insight gleaned from the fracas over Chinese engineering student Wang Jianwei's article titled "Cascade-Based Attack Vulnerability on the U.S. Power Grid." Wang's study appeared last year in the Safety Science journal and has been online since spring 2009. Its abstract's first sentence reads: "The vulnerability of real-life networks subject to intentional attacks has been one of the outstanding challenges in the study of the network safety."

Wang, a student at China's elite Dalian University of Technology, addressed known power-grid weaknesses and ways to attack them. Wang claims he wants to reduce grid vulnerabilities and the published paper is an alert.

Several U.S. defense analysts who read the paper, among them Larry Wortzel, were not so sanguine. In testimony on March 10 to the House Foreign Affairs Committee, Wortzel mentioned Wang's paper in passing, but suggested it served as a template for an attack on the entire U.S. power grid.

**U-2 Spy Plane Evades the Day of Retirement**

(NY Times) The U-2 spy plane, the high-flying aircraft that was often at the heart of cold war suspense, is enjoying an encore. Four years ago, the Pentagon was ready to start retiring the plane, which took its first test flight in 1955. But Congress blocked that, saying the plane was still useful.

And so it is. Because of updates in the use of its powerful sensors, it has become the most sought-after spy craft in a very different war in Afghanistan.

As it shifts from hunting for nuclear missiles to detecting roadside bombs, it is outshining even the unmanned drones in gathering a rich array of intelligence used to fight the Taliban.

All this is a remarkable change from the U-2's early days as a player in United States-Soviet espionage. Built to find Soviet missiles, it became famous when Francis Gary Powers was shot down in one while streaking across the Soviet Union in 1960, and again when another U-2 took the photographs that set off the Cuban missile crisis in 1962. Newer versions of the plane have gathered intelligence in every war since then and still monitor countries like North Korea.

This effort employs commercial technology, as used by TV (mainly sports) and police (security videos) organizations. The military version will handle UAV and security videos, and is called Valiant Angel. The system can hold over 20 petabytes. That's a thousand terabytes, which is, in turn, a thousand gigabytes. A gigabyte is a billion bytes. Each byte being eight bits, the smallest piece of digital information. A byte is commonly used to represent a numeral, letter of the alphabet, special symbol, or color of a pixel on an electronic display.

Tatsächlich war dort ein Konzentrationslager, in dem Tausende Juden inhaftiert und ermordet wurden. Auch hatte sich bis dahin niemand gewundert, warum der angebliche „Fluggastabfertiger“ nach dem Krieg bis 1953 unter falschem Namen gelebt hatte.

**General Jaruzelski was military counter-intelligence agent?**

(thenews.pl) Former communist interior minister General Czeslaw Kiszczak recruited Wojciech Jaruzelski for counter-intelligence purposes in the 1950s, reveals the Institute of National Remembrance (IPN).

IPN has found documents in the infamous German Stasi archives which allegedly prove that in 1952 the then colonel Wojciech Jaruzelski began cooperation with the then captain Czeslaw Kiszczak, who worked for the Main Directorate of Information of the Polish Army - the military police and counter-espionage organ in communist Poland.

Both Jaruzelski and Kiszczak deny the accusations. "I have no idea where this sensational news came from. In 1952 I didn't even know that in the Polish Army there was an officer named Wojciech Jaruzelski. I saw Jaruzelski for the first time in my life while I was a student at the Military Academy between 1954 and 1957," said Kiszczak. The former communist interior minister added that he personally met General Jaruzelski only in 1960s.

"There is only one word to describe this information - a lie," General Wojciech Jaruzelski commented on his alleged cooperation with the counter-intelligence service.

**CSIS puts Cold War spy tools on public display**

**The Iraq Papers**

(FAS) An extensive compilation of official documents, policy advocacy statements, and assorted commentary on the U.S. decision to go to war in Iraq in 2003 is presented in "The Iraq Papers," a new book from Oxford University Press.

Since it seems that there will be no new official reckoning of the Iraq war or other Bush Administration policy choices, it will be left to others to achieve their own understanding of the Bush era and its aftermath. "The Iraq Papers" provides one possible documentary starting point.

"The decision to invade Iraq launched a new doctrine of preemptive war, mired the American military in an intractable armed conflict, disrupted world petroleum supplies, cost the United States billions of dollars, and damaged or ended the lives of hundreds of thousands of Americans and Iraqis," the book states.

The book editors are not overly perplexed by these events. Somewhat heavy-handedly, they offer their own interpretation of events involving the decisive influence of neo-conservatives, the unitary executive, and a U.S. drive to global hegemony, among other factors. Alternative explanations are not considered here. (b)

### Al Mazeina lectures on Al Mabhouh's assassination

(Dubai Police HQ) Dubai Police ability to pinpoint in record time the assassins of Mahmoud Al Mabhouh, the Hamas commander, was the topic of a lecture at the Interpol's headquarters in Lyon France.



Major Gen Khamis Al Mazeina, Deputy Commander-in-Chief of Dubai Police, gave the lecture which was held during the annual Conference of the Heads of National Central Bureaux. Al Mabhouh was found dead in his hotel room in Al Bustan Rotana Hotel in January 20 and his killers injected him with the drug succinylcholine to sedate him before they suffocated him. Dubai Police has identified a total of 26 suspects have so far to have been involved in the crime.

Major General AL Mazeina, said "several countries" asked Interpol for details of the department's investigation into the assassination of Mahmoud al Mabhouh "so they can include it in their respective police academy curriculums".

The lecture shed light on the actions taken to identify the suspects, including details outlining the passports used by the suspects, DNA found at the scene, credit-card numbers and statements made by witnesses.
