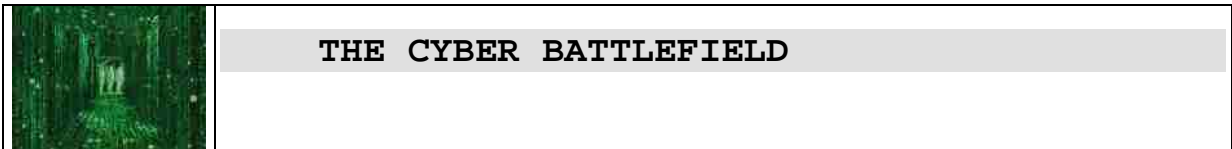

We had decided, however, for long, not to waste anybody's precious time with our problems. It is the result (the weekly newsletter, more or less punctually) that counts in the end.

Today, however, we are going to share our nightly experience with you for some reasons:

- a) just for your plain and simple information,
- b) for your amusement,
- c) and/ or to show you how we got rid of our "problem" because it might be your problem too, in case you are editing a newsletter yourself.

and was uploaded to the ACIPSS-server the same minute

The time difference as seen in this server sheet is caused partially due to a badly synchronised windows system clock and partially due to two different (internet) time zones, which is NOT the problem addressed here.

Much to our annoyance (we were already tired as dogs then) our mail client produced the following error script over and over again:

We looked up the "Fehlernummer 0x800CCC6F" in the web and were advised to run a Windows registry scan. Which we did, nn problems were found and "fixed" (whereupon other programs would not work any more, also not the problem here) but, alas, the email with the newsletter could not be sent.

This morning one of our tech wizards took a closer look into the matter and directed our attention towards the "banned URL": <http://Networkads.net>. We had reported on that malware affecting WordPress-blogs in 1045/2010:

Our table of contents copied into the email initially (!!!) showed the according entry:

```

1045/2010··Hundreds·of·Wordpress·Blogs·Hit·by·'Networkads.net'·Hack¶

```

Although this specific entry was NOT placed as a link (please note the missing characteristic blue font), the anti-spam-filter at our provider apparently went mad because of those 13 plain letters (and a dot).

So we just deleted "networkads.net", with the new line now as follows:

1045/2010  Hundreds of Wordpress Blogs Hit by Hack

```

And "voila", it worked.

Summary: If you encounter similar problems, just have a look if your have placed some "banned URLs" in the message block of your email, even if they are not formatted as a link.
