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(Rponline) Vertreter westlicher Geheimdienste befürchten, dass sich Pakistan neben Afghanistan zu einem weiteren gefährlichen Kriegsschauplatz entwickelt. Die Lage in Pakistan sei "nicht mehr im Griff", war aus CIA-Kreisen am Mittwoch in Kabul zu erfahren. Das Land drohe zu zerbrechen, sagte ein CIA-Angehöriger. In Washington lägen "detaillierte Pläne bereit, schlimmstenfalls mit Bodentruppen auf pakistanisches Territorium vorzurücken".

Am meisten befürchten die USA den drohenden Zugriff von Al Qaida auf die pakistanischen Atomwaffen. Das wäre für die Welt der "Super-GAU". In einem Artikel des "Combating Terrorism Center" von der amerikanischen Militäarakademie West Point heißt es, die meisten Lagerstätten der pakistanischen atomaren Waffen seien "in der Nähe oder sogar innerhalb von Regionen, die von pakistanischen Taliban dominiert werden und Heimstätte von Al-Qaida-Terroristen sind". Meldungen, dass es bereits Anschläge gegen die verbunkerten Atomanlagen gegeben habe, wurden von der Regierung in Islamabad stets dementiert. Pakistan soll über 50 bis 60 Atomsprengköpfe verfügen.

Gerade in den vergangenen Tagen haben die Taliban Hunderte von Versorgungskonvois in Brand gesteckt. "Damit wollen die Taliban eine Wende am Hindukusch und auch in Pakistan herbeiführen", sagte der CIA-Mann. Ohne genügend Nachschub werde in Afghanistan bald nichts mehr laufen. Die brennenden LKWs seien der "beste Beweis", dass die pakistanischen

Sicherheitskräfte den Konvois keinen Schutz geben können. Das beweise, wie sehr die Situation Pakistans außer Kontrolle geraten sei.

**NATO's Lack of a Strategic Concept**

(StratFor) Twenty-eight heads of state of the North Atlantic Treaty Organization (NATO) will meet in Lisbon on Nov. 20 to approve a new "Strategic Concept," the alliance's mission statement for the next decade. This will be NATO's third Strategic Concept since the Cold War ended. The last two came in 1991 – as the Soviet Union was collapsing – and 1999 – as NATO intervened in Yugoslavia, undertaking its first serious military engagement.

During the Cold War, the presence of 50 Soviet and Warsaw Pact armored divisions and nearly 2 million troops west of the Urals spoke far louder than mission statements. While Strategic Concepts were put out in 1949, 1952, 1957 and 1968, they merely served to reinforce NATO's mission, namely, to keep the Soviets at bay. Today, the debate surrounding NATO's Strategic Concept itself highlights the alliance's existential crisis.

**Germany elected non-permanent member of UN Security Council**

(Auswärtiges Amt) By a margin of a single vote, the German bid for a non-permanent seat on the Security Council succeeded in the first round of voting. "This vote is a sign of great confidence and of course also a gesture of faith in the work of the Federal Republic of Germany," Foreign Minister Guido Westerwelle said after the election. He added that everything possible would be done in the next two years to warrant the trust that had been placed in Germany.

Voting was conducted by secret ballot, with a two-thirds majority needed for each of the seats to be filled on the Security Council. Along with Germany, Portugal and Canada applied for the two seats in the Western European and Other States Group.

Portugal ultimately won the second seat in further rounds of voting. At the beginning of 2011 Germany and Portugal will assume the seats currently occupied by Austria and Turkey.

**Iran arrests five for spying to foreign countries**

(xinhuanet) Iran's judiciary announced the arrest of five individuals for passing classified information from Iranian administrative institutions to foreign countries, the local satellite Press TV reported on Wednesday.

Tehran's Prosecutor General Abbas Jafari Dolatabadi said Wednesday that the detainees collaborated with foreign intelligence services for money, the report said. The arrested people were also linked to foreign countries, including the United States, the official IRNA news agency said.

Dolatabadi cautioned administrators at different governmental centers to exercise vigilance so that the country's intelligence cannot be compromised to the enemy. "The enemies are not sitting idle. They are striving to collect sensitive data from all organizations as the Americans have initiated some efforts this way," Dolatabadi was quoted as saying by Press TV .

**Iran halts Western spying on its nuke plants**

(Pak Daily Times) Iran has put paid to Western spying on its nuclear facilities by ensuring that its physicists and engineers are better looked after, atomic energy chief Ali Akbar Salehi said. Salehi, who is also a vice president, said that in the past Western countries had lured Iranian nuclear specialists abroad "with offers of better education or jobs outside Iran", the Fars news agency reported. "People who fell for it in the past unfortunately leaked information abroad," the news agency quoted him as saying. "But the (Iranian Atomic Energy) Organisation has been able to gain the trust of its engineers and address their concerns, so they can continue to work in the organisation without any concerns," he added.

Salehi's remarks were not the first admission by Iran of Western or Israeli espionage efforts against its nuclear programme—it has arrested a number of suspected spies in the past with prosecutors generally seeking the death penalty. In November 2008, Iran executed telecommunications engineer Ali Ashtiari after he was found guilty of spying for Israel's Mossad spy

agency. Ashtari was convicted of involvement in a Mossad plot to intercept the communications of Iranian military and nuclear officials.

### **Pakistan spy agency's militant links worrying**

(Reuters) Top U.S. defense officials are concerned some elements of Pakistan's spy agency may be interacting improperly with the Taliban and other insurgent groups, a Pentagon spokesman said on Thursday.

Colonel David Lapan said Pakistani Army General Ashfaq Parvez Kayani, himself a former spy chief, was aware of U.S. concerns about the Inter-Services Intelligence agency and shared some of them. Lapan's comments followed a Wall Street Journal report this week that quoted some U.S. officials and Afghan militants as saying members of the ISI were pressing Taliban field commanders to fight the United States and its allies in Afghanistan.

"The ISI has done a great deal in fighting terrorism ... but we also have some concerns with ... the strategic focus of the ISI," Lapan told reporters at the Pentagon.

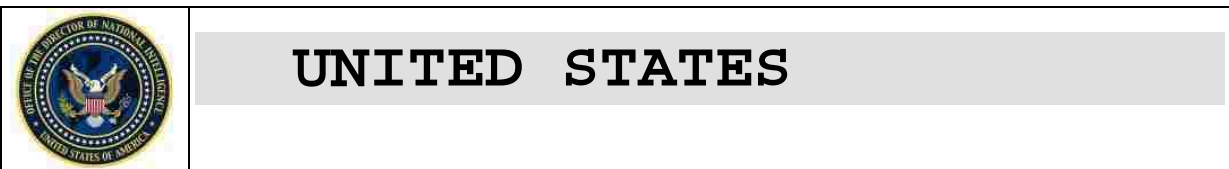
### **Iran: Economic sanctions More Dangerous Than Bombs**

(StrategyPage) The economic sanctions are becoming more of a problem. For example, most of the traditional gasoline (petrol) suppliers are no longer shipping to Iran. Smugglers are sending in poor quality fuel, knowing that

the Iranians will buy it anyway. Iran has proclaimed that it will build gasoline refineries to eliminate the need for imports, but the government has been saying that for years, and now, in addition to the usual corruption and incompetence, they have stronger sanctions that make more suppliers unwilling to do business with Iran. New U.S. economic sanctions are scaring off the major industrial players. This is making it much more difficult for Iran to maintain their oil production equipment, or build new facilities. Sanctions have also been put on key individuals in Iran, who can no longer move around freely outside Iran.

The government is increasingly alarmed at the continued resistance to the religious dictatorship. So the government is fighting back. In the last few weeks, two reform parties were outlawed and more reformers have been prosecuted and sentenced to longer prison sentences. This pushes the resistance underground, and leads to more violent attacks against the government. But the government finds the message reformers are putting out (democracy, more effective government and less corruption) to be increasingly popular. This is more dangerous than bombs.

**GANG OF 37? (Congressional Oversight)**

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(thecypresstimes) A section of the fiscal year 2010 Intelligence Authorization Act requires notification of the entire membership of the two intelligence committees of extremely sensitive "covert actions" undertaken by the intelligence community. This is an amendment to a 1991 law, passed in response to Iran-Contra, which first required notification of such activities to the so-called "gang of eight" (the leaders of both house and the chairmen and ranking members of the intelligence committees).

The new law continues the "gang of eight" notifications, but requires additional briefings to the rest (a total of 37) of the committee members with a "general description" of the activity. This is no-doubt because of recent controversy about the more restricted notifications: Some intelligence committee members were embarrassed because they didn't know about enhanced interrogation techniques of terrorists that had apparently been briefed to the "gang".

Ironically, however, this turned out to be mostly a political charade, as one prominent "gang" member, Nancy Pelosi, claimed she didn't know of the activities. While no one - at least no one who understands how the system works - really believed her, it demonstrates that "knowing" about something controversial the intelligence community is doing (especially something that later become a political liability to those who did "know" about it) may not be an advantage.

#### **Changing the Status Quo: Congressional Oversight of the CIA**

(International Affairs Review) With the recent passage of the first intelligence authorization bill in six years, congressional oversight of covert action will expand to unprecedented levels.

According to the Washington Post, in most instances the entire membership of the House Permanent Select Committee on Intelligence (HPSCI) and the Senate Select Committee on Intelligence (SSCI) will be permitted to attend briefings detailing the CIA's covert action programs. In the past, these types of briefings were limited to the so-called "Gang of Eight", a group that was limited to the party leadership in both, the House and the Senate, as well as the chairs and ranking minority members of the HPSCI and SSCI. In extremely sensitive operations, the bill grants the White House authority to restrict the briefings to the Gang of Eight; even then the full committees will still receive a "general description" of the contents of the presidential finding that was required to launch the covert action program.

Despite the best intentions of the bill's authors, it is unlikely that this additional oversight will reduce the number of legally (and morally) questionable activities the CIA undertakes. In fact, since the reforms resulting from the 1970s-era Church Committee, Congress has had more briefings and more access to classified material than ever before, yet programs such as Iran-Contra, warrantless wiretapping, and enhanced interrogation were still carried out.

#### **DNI Disbands the Intelligence Science Board**

(FAS) The Intelligence Science Board (ISB), which was established in 2002 to provide independent scientific advice to the Director of National Intelligence, has been disbanded by the new DNI, James R. Clapper Jr., as part of a process of reorganizing and streamlining the ODNI organization.

"My understanding is that the Director will be disbanding all 20 of his advisory boards, which includes the ISB," one participant in Intelligence Science Board studies told Secrecy News. DNI Clapper "did a zero base

review of all outside advisory boards as part of an efficiency review," an ODNI official said. "The new strategy is to have one Senior Advisory Group and then convene Task Forces on specific issues as needed." The Task Forces in turn "may have expiration dates." The membership of the new umbrella Advisory Group is now in formation, the official said.

The overall contribution of the Intelligence Science Board is difficult for an outsider to assess, since little of its work has been made public. But the Board's 2006 report on "Educing Information", which authoritatively explained that there was no empirical justification for the use of coercive interrogation (or torture), remains a milestone in the field. It demonstrated independent judgment as well as immediate policy relevance.

An ODNI spokesman said the move to eliminate the Board should not be seen as a rejection of science advice, but as a step toward a smaller standing bureaucracy and increased efficiency.

**Gen Jim Jones, NSA, Leaves Obama Admin**

The president says deputy national security adviser, Tom Donilon, will succeed Jones in what Mr. Obama called one of the most difficult jobs in the U.S. government. She said Donilon has played a key role in every major policy decision. He has been heavily involved in shaping the U.S. strategy in Afghanistan.

The president said Jones had agreed to serve as national security adviser for two years when accepting the role in early 2009. Prior to working in the Obama White House, Jones spent nearly 40 years in the U.S. military, where he served as a Marine Corps general.

**Intelligence Chief Says Intel Community Ashamed Of Leaks**

(US News) President Obama's head of intelligence says there's a "hemorrhage of leaks" going on in Washington, thanks to senior intelligence officials "who get their jollies from blabbing to the media." And it's so bad that it's making Obama anxious, causing shame in his intelligence operations.

Director of National Intelligence James Clapper met with Obama earlier this week and said he "was ashamed to have to sit there and listen to the president express his great angst about the leaking that is going on here in this town." Clapper revealed the situation at an intelligence reform conference in Washington this week. Of course, leaks are not new in Washington, and neither is anger in the Oval Office about intelligence leaks. Like Obama, former President Bush also got hot when information was leaked and his administration took the effort to sniff out leakers.

In Obama's case, he and Clapper are upset with the Web site Wikileaks which has released thousands of pages of classified information about the war in Afghanistan. The "Wikileaks episode," said Clapper, is a "big yellow flag. I think it's going to have a very chilling effect on the need to share."

**New Pak Taliban Operative Feared Inside US After Times Square Failure**

(FOX News) Senior U.S. officials are concerned over recent intelligence indicating that the Pakistani Taliban, which orchestrated the failed Times Square bombing, may have successfully placed another operative inside the United States to launch a second attack, sources tell Fox News. Authorities, however, know very little about the potential operative or any possible plot.

"[We] don't know who it is and don't know where it is," one source said. "We know the guy's here, but don't know anything about him."

Based on the intelligence, authorities believe the Pakistani Taliban, also known as Tehrik-e Taliban Pakistan, would have directed the individual to attempt another Times Square-style operation, but not necessarily in New York City.

A senior intelligence official said the threat stream's lack of specificity makes it nearly impossible for the counterterrorism community to defend against such an attack. Any possible threat, however, does not seem to be imminent, with a senior counterterrorism official saying he was "unaware" of any "imminent threats" against the U.S. homeland.

**FBI allegedly caught using GPS to spy on student**

(CNN) A California student got a visit from the U.S. Federal Bureau of Investigation this week after he found a secret GPS tracking device on his car, and a friend posted photos of it online.

The post prompted wide speculation about whether the device was real, whether the young Arab-American was being targeted in a terrorism investigation and what the authorities would do. It took just 48 hours to find out: The device was real, the student was being secretly tracked and the FBI wanted their expensive device back, the student told Wired.com in an interview Wednesday.

The answer came when half-a-dozen FBI agents and police officers appeared at Yasir Afifi's apartment complex in Santa Clara, California, on Tuesday demanding he return the device.

- "We're going to make this much more difficult for you if you don't cooperate."
- "We have all the information we needed,"
- "You don't need to call your lawyer. Don't worry, you're boring. "

(Sydney Morning Herald) A Syrian man freed by a federal judge from the US prison at Guantanamo Bay is suing the US government for damages from what he calls a 'Kafkaesque nightmare'.

The 44-page lawsuit by Abdul Razak al-Janko, 32, who is living in Europe, describes a decade-long odyssey of detention - first in Taliban-era Afghanistan, where he was tortured as an alleged pro-American Israeli spy, and later in US military prisons that ignored or misdiagnosed his history as a torture victim.

In addition, Mr Janko alleges that US soldiers urinated on him on his May 2002 arrival at Guantanamo, where he was subsequently subjected to solitary confinement and sleep deprivation and beaten. He said he attempted to commit suicide 17 times.

The US administration had no comment. 'We're reviewing the suit and will respond in court,' Dean Boyd, a spokesman for the Justice Department's national security division, said.

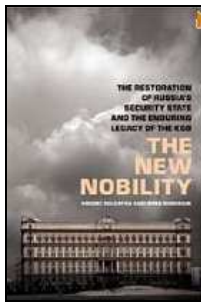

Das Budget des FSB wird nicht veröffentlicht und die Gesamtzahl der Mitarbeiter wird geheim gehalten. Nach vorsichtigen Schätzungen beschäftigt der Dienst mehr als 200 000 Leute. Seit zehn Jahren hat Putin, selbst KGB- und FSB-Veteran, die Macht im Kreml inne, zunächst als Präsident und jetzt als Ministerpräsident. Er hat den FSB zum wichtigsten Sicherheitsdienst Russlands gemacht, indem er dafür sorgte, dass große Teile des früheren KGB im FSB aufgingen. Er hat ihm das Recht garantiert, auch im Ausland zu operieren, Geheimdienstinformationen zu sammeln und Spezialmissionen auszuführen.

**Russian SLBM Shows Up In North Korea**

(StrategyPage) A recent military parade in North Korea featured the first public appearance of the long rumored RSM-25 (or Musudan) missile. This is a variant of the Russian SS-N-6 submarine launched missile. The North Korean version is believed to weigh 20 tons and have a range of over 3,000 kilometers. But there have been no tests, so it's uncertain if the North Koreans have been able to make the Russian design work for them.

The SS-N-6 is a 1960s vintage ballistic missile, and is known in Russia as the R-27. SS-N-6 is a NATO code name for the R-27. This was Russia's first true submarine launched ballistic missile (SLBM), and sixteen of them were carried in Yankee class SSBNs (missile carrying nuclear submarines.) The 12 ton R-27 had a range of 2,800 kilometers and uses storable liquid fuel. This means it can be ready for launch in less than half an hour.

After the R-27 was replaced by more modern missiles in the 1970s, the missile continued to be used for scientific research until 1990. By that time, 492 R-27s had been launched, 87 percent of them successfully.

It would be very embarrassing for the Russians if someone had illegally exported SS-N-6/R-27 missiles to North Korea.

"We hope that Ms. Chapman has found a reliable partner for a number of her projects represented by the bank, while the bank itself has acquired an extremely creative and multi-skilled individual who is truly concerned about the future of Russia and the problems of developing its domestic industries", says a written statement published on the bank's website.

28-year-old Chapman, whose association with the bank was because of her genuinely IT knowledge or was just about her fame, was working as a spy in the United States by using her computer to communicate with a Russian official.

Ahmadinejad is due to pay an official two-day visit to Lebanon on Wednesday and Thursday, during which he will hold talks with Lebanese officials and tour areas near the border with Israel.

The visit of the Iranian leader coincides with threats by Hezbollah of a fresh round of violence in Lebanon stemming from the UN tribunal investigating the 2005 assassination of former prime minister Rafik Hariri.

**Al-Qaida claims credit for attacks on Yemen intelligence**

(xinhuanet) The Yemen-based al-Qaida wing on Saturday claimed responsibility for a string of deadly attacks against the intelligence personnel and facilities in the north and south of the country.

In a statement posted on jihadist forums, al-Qaida in the Arabian Peninsula (AQAP) said they were behind the Sept. 25 ambush of a bus carrying top intelligence officers in the capital Sanaa, claiming they killed 14 of them and injuring the others. The AQAP set the ambush when the counter-terrorism officers were en-route to practice in the area after they had finished a U. S.-sponsored training course in Sanaa. All "Mujahideen" assailants returned to their hideout unharmed, said the statement.

On Sept. 25, an intelligence official told Xinhua at least two intelligence agents were killed and eight others wounded in an al-Qaida attack on their bus in Sanaa. He said three masked al-Qaida gunmen with AK-47 rifles fired at a police bus driving near the Al-Eyman University, a religious university run and owned by Sheik Abdulmajid al-Zandani, other Salafi clerics and tribesmen.

**Hamas takes hard line against suspected spies in Gaza**

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(The National) he campaign in the Gaza Strip to purge Israel's alleged snitches and spies officially began with two blindfolded men and a firing squad.

Hamas used their execution in April to announce a stark choice for those Gazans carrying out espionage for Israel: turn yourselves in during the next two months and attend a rehabilitation programme or face arrest and a possible death sentence handed down in a military court.

Using information obtained from Gazans who surrendered, Hamas is rooting out suspected collaborators with the help of a mysterious committee, whose members and activities have not been revealed. The Islamist movement that has ruled the Gaza Strip since 2007 has spoken publicly of the courses it sponsors at schools on how to detect Israeli surveillance devices, but it has made few other details on its counter-espionage measures available.

It says outsiders cannot be allowed to observe the amnesty and re-education programmes because the identity of their participants would be compromised. As a result, speculation about witch-hunts and disappearances has raged throughout this already claustrophobic Palestinian enclave, which for years has been placed under a stifling Israeli blockade.

"There's an element of fear here now," said Hamdi Shaqqura, an official at the Gaza-based Palestinian Centre for Human Rights.

**Syria, Hezbollah and Iran: An Alliance in Flux**

(StratFor) Iranian President Mahmoud Ahmadinejad arrived in Beirut on Oct. 13 for his first official visit to Lebanon since becoming president in 2005. He is reportedly returning to the country after a stint there in the 1980s as a young Islamic Revolutionary Guard Corps (IRGC) officer tasked with training Hezbollah in Lebanon's Bekaa Valley. A great deal of controversy is surrounding his return. Rumors are spreading of Sunni militants attempting to mar the visit by provoking Iran's allies in Hezbollah into a fight (already the car of a pro-Hezbollah imam who has been defending Ahmadinejad has been blown up), while elaborate security preparations are being made for Ahmadinejad to visit Lebanon's heavily militarized border with Israel.

**Pentagon: Elements in Pakistani Intelligence Agency Support Terror**

Spokesman Col. Dave Lapan said the Pakistan intelligence service as an organization does not support terrorism, but some elements within the ISI are providing assistance to terrorists.

U.S. officials have raised concerns about whether some members of the ISI "might be interacting with terrorist organizations in ways that aren't consistent with what the government and military are doing," Lapan said.

#### **Viet Nam : Russia Returns To Cam Rahn Bay**

(StrategyPage) Russia has approached Vietnam about returning to Cam Rahn Bay. From 1979 to 2002, Russia used Cam Rahn Bay as a naval base and intelligence facility. Until 1990, when the Cold War ended, the Russian fleet not only used Cam Rahn Bay, but expanded its facilities fourfold. But as soon as the Cold War ended, the Russians withdrew everything but electronic listening facilities. In 2002, in response for Vietnamese demands for a lot more rent (\$200 million), the Russians withdrew altogether. But now, Russia and Vietnam are both concerned about China's growing naval power. The Russians are willing to return, if the Vietnamese charge a more reasonable rent.

Vietnam is likely to make a deal, as China is an ancient foe, and getting more aggressive. Vietnam has also turned to France to refurbish its military and as a source of new military equipment. This was somewhat surprising. Last December, Vietnam signed a contract to purchase six Kilo class submarines, for \$300 million each, from Russia. This was part of a larger package, that included over a dozen patrol boats, at least two frigates and dozens of aircraft. In effect, Russia was supplying weapons to modernize Vietnam's armed forces. But the Vietnamese have rethought that decision. The Russian gear on order is still on the way, but French help is sought as well.

**Sri Lanka: New National Intelligence Service**

**Japan to build third satellite**

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(UPI) Japan will build a backup satellite to take over if a malfunction occurs in a pair of radar satellites now under construction, officials said.

The backup satellite will probably be launched in 2014, and would give Japan three fully operable orbiting radar satellites, The Yomiuri Shimbun reported. Japan's two intelligence-gathering satellites have broken down, and their replacements won't be orbited until 2011 and 2012, the report said.

Japan will save money by building the backup satellite using parts and technology from the two satellites now under construction, officials at the Cabinet Satellite Intelligence Center said. The malfunctioning satellites were launched in 2003 and 2007, and have been unable to carry out monitoring functions at night.

Japan launched the now-disabled satellites for military reconnaissance following North Korea's test firing of a ballistic missile in 1998, the report said.

### **US terrorism alert dismissed as Obama politicking**

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(Sidney Morning Herald) A US terrorism alert issued this week about al-Qaeda plots to attack targets in Western Europe was politically motivated and not based on credible new information, senior Pakistani diplomats and European intelligence officials say.

The warning, which despite its vagueness led Britain, France and other countries to raise their terrorism alert levels, was an attempt to justify a recent escalation in US drone and helicopter attacks inside Pakistan that have 'set the country on fire', said Pakistan's high commissioner to Britain, Wajid Shamsul Hasan.

Dismissing claims of a developed, co-ordinated plot aimed at Britain, France and Germany, European intelligence officials also pointed the finger at the US, and specifically at the White House. 'To stitch together [the terrorist plot claims] in a seamless narrative is nonsensical,' said one well-placed official.

### **Europe's spies worried by terror alert**

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(UPI) European intelligence agencies are increasingly concerned that terrorists might carry out attacks on the continent.

For the past eight days, terror-related travel alerts issued by the United States, Britain and Japan have kept European intelligence officials at the edge of their seats. A day after the alert was issued, a U.S. drone killed what officials said were several militants, some of them German nationals, at a hideout in Pakistan.

Media reports suggested that the travel alerts were based on intelligence gathered from Ahmed Sidiqi, a German of Afghan descent in custody of U.S. forces in Afghanistan. The man from Hamburg had told U.S. interrogators about Mumbai-style attack plans in Europe.

German security officials played down the warnings.

"There is no concrete evidence for imminent attacks in Germany," German Interior Minister Thomas de Maiziere said last week.

(Die Presse) Wie zwei Tage zuvor in Belgrad kamen die Krawalle offenbar auf Bestellung: Die Schläger mit besten Verbindungen zu Mafia und Geheimdienst werden von einflussreichen Sponsoren gedeckt und finanziert.

Von einer „Schmach und Schande“ sprach nach dem verfrühten Abpfiff entsetzt Tomislav Karadzic, der Chef von Serbiens Fußballverband FSS: „Was hier passierte, war inszeniert. Und die Auftraggeber sitzen in Belgrad.“ Über Hinweise, dass „bezahlte“ Schläger aus Serbien zum Anzetteln von Krawallen nach Italien reisen würden, hatte der FSS schon zwei Tage vor dem Spiel gesprochen. Doch die Eskapaden der vermeintlichen Fans in Genua sollten selbst die schlimmsten Erwartungen übertreffen.

Nicht nur die aufwendige Logistik der Krawalle von Belgrad, sondern auch die offenbar bezahlte Anreise arbeitsloser Schläger nach Italien lassen die heimischen Medien über Drahtzieher aus Geheimdienst und Mafia-Kreisen spekulieren. Noch ist undeutlich, ob nationalistische Kreise, die sich am pro-europäischen Kurs Belgrads stören, hinter der gezielten Destabilisierung des Landes durch Hooligan-Krawalle stehen oder abgetauchte Drogenbosse, die sich für die Enteignung ihres Vermögens rächen wollen. Für die Unruhen in Genua und Belgrad macht Staatssekretär Slobodan Homen am Mittwoch „organisierte Gruppierungen, die finanzielle Unterstützung genießen“, verantwortlich. ### **Britain warned to back down in Russian spy scandal**

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(Moscow News) Britain has been told to butt out of the Litvinenko saga by London's prime suspect Andrei Lugovoi.

Lugovoi sent a sharp warning that further calls for his extradition to stand trial for the 2006 murder over KGB agent turned UK citizen Alexander Litvinenko would only sour relations as British foreign secretary William Hague visited Russia. "The more the British dig in their heels over this problem, the worse it will be for our relations with them," Lugovoi told Interfax. Russia has repeatedly denied Britain's demands for extradition, "I am very happy that our state has the same position," said Lugovoi.

Britain and Russia have both said that they would like to see bilateral relations emerge from the froideur it has sunk into. A new government in the UK looks to be an opportunity to do this, just as Barack Obama's election in the US has opened a new door to dealings between Washington and Moscow. "We want to see comprehensive developments in Russian - UK relations. Russian President Dmitry Medvedev specifically mentioned it in his message to David Cameron on May 12 [congratulating the newly-elected British Prime Minister]," foreign minister Sergey Lavrov told RIA Novosti.

### **Prisoner in spy swap deal urges Hague to take tough line with Moscow**

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(Telegraph) One of Britain's best-known Russian exiles has warned William Hague, the Foreign Secretary, not to shy away from raising difficult human rights issues when he visits Russia this week.

Igor Sutyagin, who came to the Britain from a prison camp in July as part of the biggest spy swap since the Cold War, said Russia was reverting to its authoritarian past, and increasingly reminded him of George Orwell's novel 1984.

"It is a question of how Britain sees itself. The strong must not pass injustice by," he said in a forthright interview with The Sunday Telegraph. "Maybe it will not help protect human rights but it is worth a try. If you want to sleep soundly and not reproach yourself later then there is a need to act."

Mr Sutyagin, a former academic, was arrested by Russia's FSB security service in 1999 and convicted on what he claims were trumped-up charges of passing military secrets to the United States.

**Al-Qa'ida terror cell in UK 'for new spate of attacks'**

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(Belfast Telegraph) MI5 security officers are hunting a cell of British terrorists believed to have been sent to the UK by an al-Qa'ida commander to carry out Mumbai-style attacks.

The network is connected to Ilyas Kashmiri, a one-eyed Pakistani al-Qa'ida commander who has also threatened the Commonwealth Games, sources said. Kashmiri is said to act under orders from Osama bin Laden and to have boasted that he had sent cells to attack Britain and Germany. He has claimed involvement in the 1994 kidnap of four western tourists in India alongside Omar Saeed Sheikh, the Briton who murdered the reporter Daniel Pearl.

Sources said Kashmiri still had links to terrorists in Britain, although no evidence had emerged that any had reached the stage of planning attacks. Senior al-Qa'ida members associated with Kashmiri in Pakistan were killed in the tribal areas last month, including a Briton named as Abdul Jabbar. A terrorism alert was prompted by a "campfire chat" in Pakistan in which Kashmiri allegedly told Ahmad Siddiqui, a German citizen, that he had already sent teams to Britain and Germany.

**British banks complicit in Nigerian corruption, court documents show**

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(globalwitness) British high street banks have accepted millions of pounds in deposits from corrupt Nigerian politicians, raising serious questions about their commitment to tackling financial crime, warned Global Witness in a report published today. By taking money from corrupt Nigerian governors between 1999 and 2005, Barclays, NatWest, RBS, HSBC and UBS helped to fuel corruption and entrench poverty in Nigeria.

What is so extraordinary about this story is that nearly all of these of these banks had previously fallen foul of the UK banking regulator, the Financial Services Authority (FSA), in 2001 by reportedly helping the former Nigerian dictator Sani Abacha funnel nearly a billion pounds through the UK. These banks were supposed to have tightened up their systems but as this report now shows, a few years later, they were accepting corrupt Nigerian money again. There is no sign that the FSA has taken any action this time. (a)

Global Witness's new report, *International Thief Thief*, (b) is based on analysis of court documents from litigation in London by the Nigerian government to get funds returned from the UK that were stolen by two former state governors. British banks made it possible for Dieypreye Alamieyeseigha of Bayelsa State and Joshua Dariye of Plateau State to bring their corrupt loot into the UK.

**Russians threaten adoption hold-ups over spies (Ireland)**

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(Irish Central) Russia's Ambassador to Ireland has warned that an adoption agreement between both countries may be in jeopardy because of an Irish government investigation of stolen passports.

The stolen Irish passports were later used to set up fake identities for an "Irish" couple living in New Jersey and spying on Americans. The couple were arrested by the FBI who informed the Irish government of the theft

Ambassador Mikhail Timoshkin raised the concerns after a meeting with Debbie Deegan, director of Irish charity To Russia With Love. Deegan had revealed that a passport of a member of her organization had been stolen and used by Russian agents.

Special Branch detectives from the Gardai - the Irish police - are working to pinpoint where the Irish passport details used in a Russian spy ring were copied and then inserted into the forged documents, according to reports. (a)

Gardai believe that Israel and Russia are not the only countries to have utilised stolen Irish passports and that al-Qaeda, and possibly other terrorist groups, are also using them. Ireland's neutrality makes our passports highly desirable for international undercover operations. (b)

### **Real IRA getting new weapons in Eastern Europe**

(Herald) THE Real IRA is funding terror using their crime proceeds while smuggling their deadly weapons in from Eastern Europe.

Dissident republicans are using the same Eastern European gang links they use to smuggle cigarettes and traffick women into Ireland to source the weapons for their terrorist campaign.

The Real IRA has grown into the largest extortionist gang in Ireland and is also trafficking women into Ireland to work in the sex trade to boost profits. A dissident cell in Dundalk runs one of the biggest cigarette smuggling businesses in Europe with Eastern European allies. ### **Hundreds of Northern Ireland 'terrorists' allege police torture**

(Guardian) Hundreds of men and women found guilty of terrorism offences in Northern Ireland during the Troubles are attempting to have their cases

reopened, alleging that the confessions that led to their convictions were beaten out of them by police.

The Criminal Cases Review Commission (CCRC), the body that investigates alleged miscarriages, has received applications from more than 200 people who argue that they fell victim to miscarriages of justice at the province's non-jury courts.

So far the court of appeal in Belfast has heard 26 cases referred by the commission, and has overturned convictions in 24 of those. Solicitors in Belfast and Derry say they believe many more people will be applying to the commission in the near future.

As the appeals mount, a number of men who served as detectives with the Royal Ulster Constabulary (RUC) have told the Guardian how senior officers encouraged the systematic mistreatment of suspects at Castlereagh interrogation centre in east Belfast, and elsewhere, after the establishment of the Diplock courts in 1973.

**Dissident arms cache made safe by Army**

(Irish Times) ARMY BOMB disposal experts have carried out a controlled explosion on a mortar bomb found in a suspected Real IRA arms stash.

The Army was called into the site in Co Louth where a Garda search team excavated ground in a wooded area, unearthing the mortar, a heavy machine gun, pipe bomb, shotgun and TNT explosive. Ammunition for the weapons was found with them, all buried in drums. The Army's controlled explosion could be heard over a wide area yesterday, and houses close to the site where the mortar was destroyed, were evacuated. The wood where gardaí found the barrel holding the arms was part of the extensive Barmeath estate near Togher, Co Louth.

The Garda search team examined a track of the wood some 30m (99ft) long that runs roughly parallel to the Trean Road, which forms a boundary to the wood on the eastern side. The search site is about 25m from the roadside and much shock has been expressed that it is so close to where people are living, especially families.

**Irish police uncover Real IRA weapons dump in woods**

(Belfast Telegraph) Irish police have uncovered a massive terrorist arsenal belonging to the Real IRA after pinpointing an underground hide in a wood yesterday.

Armed officers made the find during a series of searches in Co Louth and Co Meath as part of Operation Designer, which has been targeting dissident republican activities on both sides of the Border for the past year.

The arsenal was discovered in a carefully concealed hide in Barmeath Wood, outside Dunleer, Co Louth, after a widespread search involving local

gardai, Irish Special Branch, Emergency Response Unit and the Republic's National Surveillance Unit.

The haul included three kilos of TNT explosive, a light, general purpose machine gun and tripod; a rocket launcher, a large quantity of ammunition, more than a dozen detonators that had been fully assembled, a couple of timer power units and parts for other units, a large amount of bomb components, a pipe bomb and a sawn-off, double barrelled shotgun.

Special clothing thought to have been worn by terrorists to foil forensic examination of items by police experts was also found. Some of the weaponry seized was thought to have originated in eastern Europe and was likely to have been imported by the Real IRA faction aligned to the group's former director of operations, from outside Dundalk.

**Lord Saville defends £200m inquiry**

(Belfast Telegraph) The Bloody Sunday inquiry which cost nearly £200 million could not have been done "on the cheap", its author Lord Saville has said.

The Law Lord gave evidence to the Northern Ireland Affairs Committee at Westminster, where he also said it was inevitable it took 12 years to piece together the events in Londonderry in 1972.

His historic inquiry was born out of the Northern Ireland peace process and prompted an apology from Prime Minister David Cameron when he said the killings of 14 civil rights marchers by members of the Parachute Regiment were "unjustified and unjustifiable".

Lord Saville said it had been an honour to conduct the probe and that he was duty-bound to ensure the relatives of the dead and the accused soldiers got legal representation given the seriousness of the allegations at the heart of the controversy.

**Up to 30 per cent supporting dissidents**

(londonderrysentinel) THE level of sympathy for the reasons for ongoing republican violence could be as high as 30 per cent amongst card-carrying nationalists, according to a new survey by the University of Liverpool. Research by Liverpool University published last week revealed 14 per cent of nationalists had sympathy for the reasons behind ongoing violence by IRA splinter groups such as Óglaigh na hÉireann, the Real IRA and the Continuity IRA.

But the 14 per cent figure was a conservative estimate classifying participants of the ESRC Northern Ireland 2010 Westminster Election as nationalist based only upon the demographics of the area in which they were surveyed.

Of 1,002 people taking part in the survey, just 240 classed themselves as nationalists, whilst 341 classed themselves as unionist. 421 said they were neither.

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(news.de) Spione vor Gericht: In Berlin sind zwei Libyer angeklagt, oppositionelle Landsleute in Deutschland ausgespäht zu haben. News.de zeigt, welche Länder hierzulande ihre Kritiker überwachen und wo die Geheimdienste ihre Stützpunkte haben.

Sie sitzen in kugelsicheren Panzerglasboxen und verweigern die Aussage: Unter strengen Sicherheitsvorkehrungen wird seit Ende September vor dem Kammergericht Berlin gegen die Libyer Adel Ab. und Adel Al. verhandelt. Der Vorwurf der Generalbundesanwaltschaft: Sie sollen für den Geheimdienst ihres Landes Oppositionelle in Deutschland und Westeuropa ausgespäht haben - mit dem Ziel, die Bewegung der Kritiker bis hin zu ihrer Zerschlagung zu schwächen.

Demnach hat der 46-jährige Al. etwa im August 2009 bei einer Amnesty-International-Mahnwache gegen den libyschen Staatschefs Gaddafi Fotos von Demonstranten gemacht und Exillibyer ausgeforscht. Die Aufnahmen übergab er dann seinem Führungsoffizier - Adel Ab. Der 43-jährige arbeitete als Beamter des libyschen Außenministeriums und soll europaweit ein Netz von Agenten geleitet haben. Ende September wurde mit Omar K. in Halle an der Saale ein weitere Spion von Ab. festgenommen.

All das klingt eigentlich nach einem Hollywood-Agentenfilm und nicht nach Halle an der Saale. Doch die bittere Realität ist: Nicht nur Libyen überwacht seine Exilanten in Deutschland. Der Verfassungsschutz listet in seinem Jahresbericht 2009 weitere Länder auf, die peinlich genau darauf achten, wie sich die Landsleute im Ausland über die eigene Regierung äußern. So etwa China, Iran, Nord-Korea.

### **Germany seeks handover of Islamic militant**

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(AP) German prosecutors said Monday they are seeking the handover of the Islamic militant whose disclosures under U.S. interrogation in Afghanistan helped trigger Europe's terror alert.

A request for the transfer of the 36-year-old German of Afghan descent has been filed to the relevant U.S. authorities with a view to prosecuting him in Germany, a spokesman for the federal prosecutor's office said. He spoke on condition of anonymity in line with department policy.

Germany accuses Ahmad Wali Siddiqui, who was arrested by the U.S. military in July in Afghanistan, of membership in a foreign terrorist organization - the Islamic Movement of Uzbekistan. Germany issued an arrest warrant for him in April, the spokesman said. The 36-year-old Siddiqui is believed to have been part of the Hamburg militant scene that also included key Sept. 11, 2001, plotters. German officials have said he left Germany in March 2009 to seek paramilitary training in Pakistan's lawless border region.

Siddiqui is an old friend of Mounir el Motassadeq, who was convicted in Germany in connection with Sept. 11, and frequented the same mosque where the Hamburg-based plotters often met, German officials said last week.

Richard Holbrooke, the U.S. special representative for Pakistan and Afghanistan, said in Berlin on Monday that German officials had access to the man in U.S. custody and that the two nations were in contact to evaluate the request for his handover.

#### **Razzia beim Nordbank-"Geheimdienst"**

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(Hamburger Morgenpost) HSH-Nordbank geht in die nächste Runde. Rund 100 Polizisten durchsuchten in der vergangenen Woche die Büroräume der Sicherheitsfirma Prevent in Norderstedt, München und Frankfurt, berichtet der „Spiegel“.

Im Visier der Ermittler: Unterlagen der Firma, die für die HSH arbeitet, und die beweisen sollen, dass die Bank mit offenbar kriminellen Methoden ihr Vorstandsmitglied Frank Roth geschasst hat. Verwandte Büros, engagierte Privatdetektive, falsche Beschuldigungen - so soll die HSH ihren unliebsamen Mitarbeiter Roth losgeworden sein. Die Firma Prevent, die allein im vergangenen Jahr Aufträge mit einem Volumen von mehr als sieben Millionen Euro von der Bank erhalten hat, wird als Zeugin im Verfahren geführt.

Prevent-Sprecher Ralf Schneider betont: „Es liegt nichts gegen uns vor. Wir sind Zeuge, nicht Beschuldigte. Es wird gegen einen Dritten ermittelt.“ Dieser Dritte ist offenbar hochrangiger Mitarbeiter der Bank, der vor einigen Monaten von seinen Aufgaben entbunden wurde. Dieser soll Roth einen Privatdetektiv auf den Hals gehetzt haben.

Und auch im New Yorker Kinderporno-Skandal der HSH-Nordbank steht Prevent auf der Liste der Ermittler. In dieser Filiale der Bank wurden einem Mitarbeiter Kinderporno-Fotos untergeschoben, um ihn loszuwerden. Auch hier betont Prevent-Sprecher Schneider, dass noch nicht geklärt sei, ob ein Prevent-Mitarbeiter zu den Beschuldigten oder den Zeugen gehören wird.

Je länger der Göttinger Chemieprofessor sich intensiv mit dem Attentat der RAF auf seinen Vater im April 1977 in Karlsruhe beschäftigte, umso mehr kam er zu der Überzeugung, dass Verena Becker sich bei den Strafverfolgern einer "schützenden Hand" erfreuen konnte.

Bei der überfälligen Freigabe aller Akten ließen sich auch Kraushaars Hypothesen besser überprüfen. Schließlich sind diejenigen, die den Fall Buback aufklären wollen, derzeit vor allem auf Indizien und Mutmaßungen angewiesen. "Der Autor dieser Untersuchung", so heißt es mit der Vorsicht eines Wissenschaftlers zusammenfassend, "hat keine Belege für eine Informantentätigkeit Verena Beckers für den Verfassungsschutz vor 1977."

Doch die Ungereimtheiten und Verdachtsmomente, die Kraushaar zusammengetragen hat, reichen aus, den Bundesanwälten neue Alpträume von einem alten Fall zu bescheren.

Kürzlich wurden dem amerikanischen Journalisten Jeremy Scahill Dokumente zugespielt, die aufzeigen, dass neben der US-Regierung auch das Königreich Jordanien, die kanadische Armee, die holländische Polizei, Monsanto, Walt Disney Company, Royal Caribbean Cruises und eben auch die Deutsche Bank zu den namhaften Kunden zählen.

### Steuer-Spion erhängte sich mit Fernsehkabel

(Blick) Er verkaufte eine Daten-CD, wurde geschnappt - und erhängte sich in der Zelle. Die Polizei untersuchte nun den Tod von Steuer-Spion Wolfgang U. (†42).

Nachdem die erste Steuer-CD an den deutschen Fiskus verkauft worden war, wollte auch der Tiroler Wolfgang U. (42) auf den Zug aufspringen. Gemäss Informationen der österreichischen «Kronen Zeitung» empfahl er sich mindestens einem Komplizen aus Bankkreisen als Strohmännchen. Er presste Daten von fast 2000 deutschen und österreichischen Steuerflüchtlern auf eine CD und bot sie den Behörden beider Länder zum Kauf an. Im Februar war das bereits die dritte solche CD, die herübergereicht wurde.

Mitte September verhaftete die Schweizer Bundesanwaltschaft Wolfgang U. in Winterthur. Im Regionalgefängnis Bern erhängte er sich schliesslich mit dem Fernsehkabel, wie die Polizei mitteilt. Die Behörden schließen Dritteinwirkung aus. Wolfgang U. plante seinen Tod offenbar akribisch. So habe er «bewusst» darauf geachtet, dass niemand auf sein Vorhaben aufmerksam werden konnte.

Aber die Politik ist mit derart vielen Themen konfrontiert, da kann das Thema rasch wieder an Dringlichkeit verlieren.“ Kurt Einzinger, Vorstandsmitglied der Internet Service Providers Austria (ISPA), wirft ein: „Der Gesetzgeber hinkt immer hinterher.“

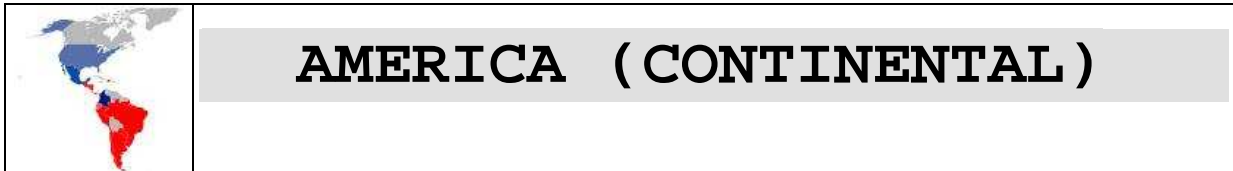

**Mexico suspends search for Hartley, intel: more killings**

(The Monitor) Mexico's search for McAllen man David Michael Hartley was temporarily suspended Thursday with no definite word as to when it would resume.

Hartley, 30, is widely presumed dead after what his wife, Tiffany Young-Hartley, has described as an attack by cartel "pirates" Sept. 30 on the Mexican side of Falcon Reservoir, a sprawling waterway that spans the country's border with the U.S.

"There is a recess," Ruben Dario Rios Lopez, a spokesman for the state attorney general's office in Tamaulipas, said Thursday in Spanish. "We are going to look into new strategies between both U.S. and Mexican authorities in order to see what we can do, because up to now we have not been able to recover the body of this person."

STRATFOR, a private intelligence service based in Austin, said in a report Wednesday that its sources indicate low-level members of the Zeta drug cartel were responsible for the attack and that the group destroyed the body that same day in a bid to avoid a U.S. backlash.

**Mexican drug gangs continue to increase operations**

**U.S. intelligence penetrated Ecuadorian police force (?)**

(granma.cu) THE uprising against President Rafael Correa by a coup faction within the Ecuadorian police force is confirmed in an alarming report into the infiltration of this force by U.S. intelligence services published in 2008, which states how many members of the police departments were developing a "dependency" on the U.S. embassy in that South American country.

The report specifies that certain police units "have an informal economic dependence on the United States in terms of paying informants, training, equipment and operations."

The systematic use of corruption techniques on the part of the CIA in order to secure the "good will" of police officers was exposed on many occasions by former CIA agent Philip Agee who, prior to leaving the agency, was assigned to the U.S. embassy in Quito.

In his official report, published at the end of 2008, Ecuadorian Defense Minister Javier Ponce revealed how U.S. diplomats dedicated themselves to corrupting police officers and also officers within the Armed Forces.

Confirming that fact, the leadership of the Ecuadorian police force then announced it intended to sanction its agents who were collaborating with Washington, while the U.S. embassy declared the "transparency" of its support for Ecuador.

**Report criticises Aussie's spies**

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(The Australian) AUSTRALIAN spies have been publicly rebuked for handing over top secret information to foreign intelligence services without properly recording the exchanges.

And the number of complaints made about Australia's spy agencies has more than quadrupled in the last year. The rebuke, contained in the Inspector-General of Intelligence's annual report, finds that "in some instance there is a lack of documentary evidence that the considerations articulated in the policy are being given effect".

On the spy agency's website it states that: "Liaison with overseas liaison services is an important source of lead intelligence for ASIO, and these relationships must be continually nurtured to ensure the flow of information - information Australia might not otherwise receive."

But the report finds ASIO must "maintain appropriate records of such decision-making and approvals (to share intelligence)" and warns that "it is the potential gravity of the consequences of passing information to foreign liaisons that means documenting the basis for each decision is of particular importance".

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**Cyber warfare already here: UK spy agency chief**  
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(Economist Times) Countries are already using cyber warfare techniques to attack each other and need to be vigilant round the clock to protect computer systems, the head of Britain's communications spy agency says. Iain Lobban, the director of the Government Communications Headquarters (GCHQ), said British government systems are targeted 1,000 times each month.

"Cyberspace is contested every day, every hour, every minute, every second," he said late Tuesday in a rare speech. His remarks, to a London audience, were published Wednesday. The internet lowered "the bar for entry to the espionage game," he said. Its expansion increased the risk of disruption to infrastructure such as power stations and financial services.

"The threat is a real and credible one," said Lobban, whose GCHQ agency, a big eavesdropping operation similar to the National Security Agency in the United States, handles operations such as intelligence-gathering and code-busting. Politicians and spy chiefs in Britain and around the world have increasingly been warning about the growing cyber threat.

**Europäische Sicherheitsagentur plant Übung gegen Cyber-Attacken**  
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(futurezone) Die "Europäische Agentur für Netz- und Informationssicherheit" (ENIS) bereitet die erste größere europäische Übung gegen Cyber-Kriminalität vor. An der Übung sollen alle 27 EU-Staaten sowie die Schweiz, Norwegen und Island teilnehmen.

"Das Übungsszenario soll sich mit Vorfällen beschäftigen, die die Belastbarkeit des Internets betreffen. Diese Vorfälle betreffen alle teilnehmenden Länder." So lautet der Plan auf dem Vorbereitungsblatt zur ersten Übung der Europäischen Union gegen eine Bedrohung des Internets im EU-Raum und den Nachbarländern. Es soll der erste große Prüfstein der Europäischen Agentur für Netz- und Informationssicherheit (ENISA) werden. Die Aktualität eines solchen Test liegt nach den Stuxnet-Attacken in den vergangenen Wochen besonders nahe.

Der Plan der ENISA sieht folgendes vor: Jede Behörde eines Landes stellt sich als Mitspieler im Planspiel bereit. Jeweils eine Person einer Behörde des jeweiligen Landes leitet als Moderator die Aktionen der nationalen Behörden. Laut Otmar Lendl, Moderator für Österreich und Team-Leader des Computer Emergency Response Team in Österreich (CERT), nehmen sowohl das Bundeskanzleramt, als auch das CERT an der Übung teil. Die Aktion wird von der ENISA zentral geleitet. Die einzelnen Behörden sollen in einer gestellten Situation die möglichen Kontaktpersonen in den anderen Ländern erörtern. Bessere Kommunikationswege sollen dargestellt und Schlüsselfiguren klar aufgezeigt werden. In diesem „Tabletop“-Szenario steht dabei nicht der eigentlich simulierter Angriff im Zentrum des Tests, sondern eher die Vernetzung untereinander.

**Cyber 'strikes' up 250% (Australia)**  
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(ZDnet) Australia's top electronic spy unit says the country's military networks are under siege from soaring levels of cyber strikes by foreign intelligence agencies.

In a rare glimpse at the threat the military faces from cyber espionage, figures from the Defence Signals Directorate (DSD) show the military has experienced 700 attempts a month this year, up from 200 a month last year, Fairfax newspapers say. And while Defence will not specify who is behind the intrusions – it is often impossible given the anonymity of the web – there has been a wealth of evidence to indicate dozens of countries are prying.

It is only the second time DSD has released figures on military network intrusions. These have been gathered by an elite unit within the directorate, the Cyber Security Operations Centre.

It is staffed by defence officers and staff from the federal police, the Attorney-General's Department and the Australian Security Intelligence Organisation.

**NATO diskutiert die Cyber-Attacken**

(tagesschau) In Brüssel berät die NATO über ein neues strategisches Konzept. Laut Generalsekretär Rasmussen muss sich die Organisation stärker gegen neuartige Gefahren wie Cyber-Attacken aus dem Internet wappnen. Beschlüsse soll es spätestens auf dem Lissabon-Gipfel im November geben.

Einige Attacken sind so massiv, dass sie bedrohliche Ausmaße annehmen könnten und auch schon angenommen haben. Auch wenn der Urheber des Angriffs nicht identifizierbar ist: Hier waren Profis am Werk, möglicherweise ein Geheimdienst. Längst hat sich die NATO des Themas angenommen. Im strategischen Konzept, das die NATO derzeit erarbeitet, wird der Krieg im Netz als eine Bedrohung definiert, der die Partner gemeinsam begegnen sollen. Die NATO-Staaten haben die Brisanz der Bedrohung erkannt. Allen voran die USA.

Noch ist diese Frage recht theoretisch, denn die Urheber eines Angriffs im Internet sind schwer auszumachen. Und selbst wenn ein Land als Ort des Ursprungs von Attacken fest steht, müsste nachgewiesen werden, dass die Regierung einen solchen Angriff befohlen hat. Bleibt immer noch zu klären, welche Ziele dann die Bündnis-Partner ins Visier nehmen sollten. Derartige Überlegungen sind im Hauptquartier in Brüssel bekannt. Aus diesem Grund hat Generalsekretär Anders Fogh Rasmussen in seinem Entwurf zum strategischen Konzept die Idee festgehalten, dass ein angegriffenes Partnerland Beratungen im Bündnis verlangen kann. Dabei könnte dann - rein theoretisch - auch der Bündnisfall erklärt werden.

**Homeland Security And Spy Agency To Work Together**

(NPR) Computer experts at the secretive National Security Agency are teaming up with the Homeland Security Department in an effort to strengthen the nation's defenses against cyber attacks.

The partnership unveiled Wednesday raised concerns among civil liberties advocates, who say that safeguards are needed to ensure that the collaboration between the spy agency and Homeland Security does not wind up violating the privacy rights of U.S. citizens.

NSA and Homeland Security officials both said they are creating small teams that will work in the other agency's operations centers, a move designed to help them share lawfully gathered intelligence and provide Homeland Security faster access to the NSA's broad technical expertise.

The collaboration is a move to help the U.S. guard against the growing threat of cyber attacks against government and private computer networks. U.S. government and private networks are increasingly under attack by hackers and other cyber criminals.

**Is the Government Spying On Us Through Social Networks?**

(FOX News) Facebook founder Mark Zuckerberg famously said that "the age of privacy is over." And the government wants to ensure that, it seems.

An Electronics Frontier Foundation freedom of information request uncovered a memo encouraging agents to try to befriend people on a variety of social networks in order to take advantage of their readiness to share -- and spy on them.

"Narcissistic tendencies in many people fuels a need to have a large group of 'friends' link to their pages and many of these people accept cyber-friends that they don't even know. This provides an excellent vantage point for FDNS to observe the daily life of beneficiaries and petitioners who are suspected of fraudulent activities," according to the memo obtained by Valleywag.

According to the website, the EFF wrote that "this memo suggests there's nothing to prevent an exaggerated, harmless or even out-of-date off-hand comment in a status update from quickly becoming the subject of a full citizenship investigation." Other websites EFF say the government is spying on include Twitter, MySpace, Craigslist and Wikipedia.

**Microsoft Plugs a Record 49 Security Holes (including Stuxnet)**

(Krebs) Microsoft today issued 16 update bundles to fix a record-breaking 49 separate security vulnerabilities in computers powered by its Windows operating systems and other software.

"Microsoft has broken several of its own Patch Tuesday records this year, but this month far surpasses them all," said Joshua Talbot, security intelligence manager, Symantec Security Response. "Perhaps most notable this month is the number of vulnerabilities that facilitate remote code execution. By our count, 35 of the issues fall into this category. These are bugs that could allow an attacker to run any command they wish on vulnerable machines."

Microsoft said at least eight of the vulnerabilities were publicly disclosed prior to the release of today's patches. The software giant also fixed one of the two remaining zero-day flaws exploited by the Stuxnet worm, a complex family of malware pegged by researchers as a weapon built to attack industrial control systems embedded in facilities like power and chemical manufacturing plants.

### 7/7 Inquest: Spy-Style Mobile Tricks Used

(Sky) The July 7 suicide bombers used spy-style mobile phone tricks to evade detection, an inquest into the atrocity has revealed.

As new CCTV footage of the attacks was released to the inquest, experts told the hearing the four terrorists employed "tradecraft" counter-surveillance techniques by buying pay-as-you-go handsets. The methods ensured their communications were not intercepted. Members of the group each bought "operational" phones, which they kept separate from their personal mobiles and used solely for planning the 2005 London attacks.

From May 2005 until the attacks, bombers Mohammed Sidique Khan, 30, Shehzad Tanweer, 22, and Hasib Hussain, 18, used four different unregistered phones each DS Stuart said the four bombers displayed "tradecraft" in their use of mobile phones.

The inquests also heard that Scotland Yard made nearly 4,500 requests to phone companies for information as part of the massive investigation into the July 7 attacks.

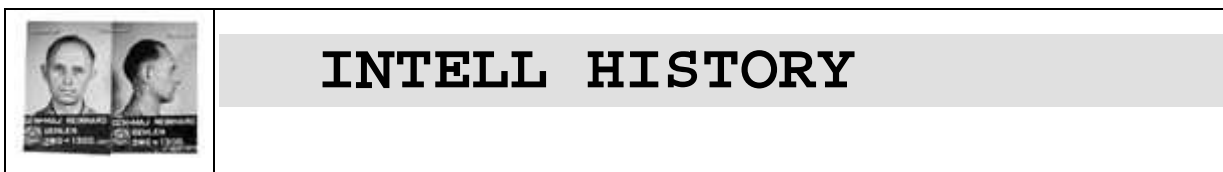
### North Korean GPS Jammer Spotted

(StrategyPage) For the last five years, South Korean intelligence has been trying to get their hands on North Korea's new GPS jammer. The South Korean recently revealed that they had evidence that these jammers were now mounted on North Korean electronic warfare vehicles. These jammers are used to spoil the aim of GPS guided bombs and missiles, and are believed to have a range of 50-100 kilometers. South Korea believes the jammer technology was obtained from Russia.

The U.S., NATO, Israel and several Middle Eastern nations (friendly to the U.S.) are big users of GPS guided weapons. The North Korean device is being

offered to Middle Eastern Nations (as in Syria, Iran and Hizbollah), and is touted as superior to the Russian model (which Iraq had, and used, without much success, in 2003). The Russians have since improved their technology, but the U.S. believes its anti-jammer devices are capable to dealing with the new Russian gear. One is never sure unless you can test the anti-jammer technology against the jammer. Thus the eagerness to get a North Korean jammer into the hands of U.S. Air Force anti-jammer experts for examination.

### **A Look Back at the Soviet Army**

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(FAS) "The Soviet Army is the best prepared force in the world to conduct both offensive and defensive NBC [nuclear, biological and chemical] operations," according to a 1984 U.S. Army manual that is newly available online.

The three-part manual, based on Soviet military literature and other open sources, provides a dauntingly detailed account of almost every aspect of Soviet military structure and operations. So, for example: "The Soviets recognize three basic types of smoke screens: blinding, camouflaging, and decoy. Each type is classified as being frontal, oblique, or flank in nature, depending on the placement of the screen."

Perhaps of equal or greater importance, the manual implicitly documents the U.S. Army's perception of the Soviet military late in the Cold War. "In the Soviet view, the correlation of forces has been shifting in favor of the socialist camp since the Soviet defeat of Nazi Germany in World War II. Soviet Marxist-Leninist ideology requires the correlation to shift continuously in favour of socialism. The correlation of forces may be advanced by both violent and nonviolent means. When it is advanced by violent means, the military component of the correlation is the dominant factor." (a)

The first volume of the manual, "The Soviet Army: Operations and Tactics," Field Manual 100-2-1, July 16, 1984 (203 pages), originally "for official Government use only," has not previously been published online. (b)

The second volume is "The Soviet Army: Specialized Warfare and Rear Area Support," FM 100-2-2, July 16, 1984. (c)

The third volume is "The Soviet Army: Troops, Organization, and Equipment," FM 100-2-3, June 1991. (d)

In February 1957, the Army produced an extremely detailed "Glossary of Soviet Military and Related Abbreviations", Army Technical Manual TM 30-546. (e)

ACIPSS-newsletter-commentary: Of even greater importance for us Europeans was the legendary Field Manual (FM) 30-102, Opposing Forces Europe (Washington: Department of the Army, November 8, 1977). This "bible" on Warsaw Pact (WaPa) assault procedures in the European Theatre of Operation had been "imported" by an Austrian General Staff Officer, having attended the US General Staff Course in Fort Leavenworth, in the early 1980s and ultimately slipped into the (admittedly small Austrian) public domain. Interesting reading stuff insofar, as FM 30-102 - amongst other interesting info - provided a list with the names and short bios of Soviet commanders down the regimental level. To this very date, it has not been officially declassified and / or made available online.

Of similar relevance was a mostly graphical study on WaPa assault deployment by the G2-shop of the British Army on the Rhine (BAOR), having been discreetly issued to the "students" of NATO's Long Range Reconnaissance Patrol (LRRP) School in Weingarten, Germany.

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**MoD took softer line on loyalist paramilitaries, secret files reveal**  
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(Guardian) MoD memos show the army practised religious discrimination in the way it dealt with paramilitaries in Northern Ireland.

The army knowingly enforced an anti-terrorist policy based on religious discrimination during the early years of Northern Ireland's Troubles, according to files unearthed in the National Archives.

Ministry of Defence memos from the early 70s reveal for the first time that senior officials acknowledged that "Protestant terrorists" were not being interned on the same basis as members of the IRA. Accusations that the government pursued repressive security measures against republican paramilitaries while adopting a softer line against loyalist gunmen and bombers fuelled sectarian resentment for many years.

During the four years that internment without trial was enforced, August 1971 to December 1975, a total of 1,981 suspects were held in Long Kesh and

other prison camps. Of those, 1,874 were Catholics or republicans, and only 107 were Protestants or loyalists.

The recently released files, discovered at the National Archives in Kew in London by researchers from the Derry-based Pat Finucane Centre, expose the official thinking behind the disparity and highlight the military's relaxed attitude towards loyalist paramilitary factions.

**Maritime Security: Actions Needed**

(GAO) Somali pirates operating off the Horn of Africa have attacked more than 450 ships and taken nearly 2,400 hostages since 2007. A small number of U.S.-flagged vessels and ships have been among those affected. As Somalia lacks a functioning government and is unable to repress piracy in its waters, the National Security Council (NSC) developed the interagency Countering Piracy off the Horn of Africa: Partnership and Action Plan (Action Plan) in December 2008 to prevent, disrupt, and prosecute piracy off the Horn of Africa in collaboration with international and industry partners. GAO was asked to evaluate the extent to which U.S. agencies (1) have implemented the plan, and any challenges they face in doing so, and (2) have collaborated with partners in counterpiracy efforts. GAO examined counterpiracy plans, activities, collaborative practices, and data, and interviewed industry and international partners and officials at U.S. agencies and the Combined Maritime Forces in Bahrain.

(Australian Policy Online) Strategically, Southeast Asia sits at the intersection of the wider world and Australia's local neighbourhood; what happens there matters to Australia. But the broader Asian security environment is in flux, and an era of strategic quiescence in Southeast Asia may be drawing to a close. Security trends there are increasingly being shaped by a set of global and broader Asian concerns as well as local ones. In consequence, traditional patterns of strategic influence and cooperation are shifting in Southeast Asia.

In this paper, Professor Carl Thayer from the Australian Defence Force Academy unpacks four patterns of strategic influence in the region, assessing the interactions between them and what they mean for Australian strategic interests.
